

July 1<sup>st</sup> 1866 Bark Mary Georgia

Remarks on board Sunday 1

this Day strong breezes from NW to SW and fair weather at 1 PM saw the Land cape Green at 5 PM cape Green bar put compass. West distance 5 leagues at 6 tack heading off ahead at 7 double reef, 3 sail. Latter Part light wind from NW to NE at 8 AM tacked and made sail at 4 all sail wind light standing in for the land cape Green and cape Maria and the land to the North in site Lat 22. 48. at 10 AM Long 41. 31. at 11 PM

Remarks on board Monday 2

this Day light air and calm from NW to NE all sail set heading in for

the land at 6 PM light from SE at 6 PM left to the wind heading SW at sun down cape Green bar off of cape Maria west and at Anna Island at 11 PM distance 5 leagues, Mountain Muescho bar at 12 PM Latter Part light wind from SE ship lying off and on at 6 AM wind SE strong breezes heading in at 9 AM off at 10 AM off for the anchorage

Remarks on board Tuesday 3

this Day strong breezes from NW to SE at 11 AM noon came to anchor in 9 fathoms of water about 6 mile from from the Main Land and 1 mile from St Anna Island the Island

has 16 to 20 fathoms got out fresh water and fill the tank and fill the cask up with salt water at 5 PM Bark Callao of New Bedford Capt Browne came to anchor, 270 tons so at 11 PM Latter Part light wind from NW or off the Land setting up close rigging etc

stand 4 watches capt and officers stand watch etc

At Anchor In St Anna Bay

Remarks on board Wednesday 4

this Day light wind from East and fine weather setting up Villain rigging at 1 PM saw no bump back Latter Part fair breezes from North at 9 AM wind to Eastward 4 boats out side whaling saw number whales at 9 AM went a shore to the village and fitting rigging etc

Remarks on board Thursday 5

this Day light wind from East at 8 PM capt returned from the shore at night the returned got nothing Latter Part light <sup>foot</sup> air from the North

the boat went out at 9 AM capt went a shore with Mr. Silver to see what he do with him

Remarks on board Friday 6

this Day fine weather and calm at 2 PM strong breezes from SW at 3 PM capt returned with Mr. Silver and 4 PM the boat left the ship with Mr. Silver the capt got him a passage to Rio de Janeiro in a brigg Latter Part strong breezes and rain from SE to SW and NE at 10 AM stuck on land and tearing

Remarks on board Saturday 7

this Day strong and light from East and NE at 4 PM took the whale a long 9 Latter Part strong breezes from North and bad weather cut in the whale 4 boat out

and sent Charles Miller boat steamer
