Bark Mary Thayer New Bedford Capt. Caldwell
Saturday Dec 1st Begins with
cloudy rainy weather good breeze from
E S E Steered S by E watch employed
making out a chain top sail and
kennel the same Sail over Boat
went on board of the Ship Wallace
from Newcastle with coal banded
to Point a Fall So ends Lat 53.00 Long 21.47

Sunday Dec 2nd Begins with
squally weather breeze S E Steered
by the wind on the Port tack saw
the Bark Leonida and Gammoned
her from 3.30 to 5.30 saw Black fish
at 8 am covered the boats but got
nothing So ends Lat 52.22 Long 21.54

Monday Dec 3rd Begins with
fine weather light breeze from
S E Steered by the wind saw
Black fish at 2 PM rainy and
squally latter part the day So ends

Tuesday Dec 4th Begins with
squally and light breeze from South
Steered by the wind saw four or
five sails watch employed repairing
the Gaff top sail So ends Lat 4.14 Long 22.44

Wednesday Dec 5th Begins with
fair weather good breeze from S E
Steered by the wind heading S W
the watch employed variously rainy
weather latter part saw three or
four sails So ends no observation

Thursday Dec 6th Begins with
squally weather breeze from S E
Steered by the wind strong breeze
latter part saw nothing watch
employed variously So ends Lat 2.21 Long 25.22

Friday Dec 7th Begins with
sunny breeze from S E Steered
by the wind on the Starboard tack
saw nothing watch employed
repairing the Main top sail So ends
Lat 0.34 Long 26.38

Saturday Dec 8th Begins with
fine weather good breeze from
S E Steered by the wind on the
Port tack saw one sail and
one Fair back So ends the day
Lat 0.58 South Long 27.02

Sunday Dec 9th Begins with
fair weather breeze from
S E Steered by the
wind on the Port tack saw two
sails watch employed repairing
the chain top sail finished
it at 4 PM So ends the day
Lat 2.52 Long 29.27

Monday Dec 10th Begins with
fine weather breeze from
S E Steered by the wind
on the Port tack saw nothing
the watch employed variously
So ends Lat 5.01 Long 29.57
