Monday Dec 21st begins with
fair weather good breeze from
North Starboard by the wind on the
Starboard tack had a moderate Gale
later part saw one sail so ends Lat 43 40 Long 57 16

Tuesday Dec 22nd begins with
a Gale from West said shore to us
the Starboard tack til 3 Pm and were
Ship rammed fog all day saw
nothing so ends no observation

Wednesday Dec 23rd begins with
a Gale from West said shore to us
the Port tack the daylight and were Ship
more moderate later part saw one
sail so ends Lat 45 72 Long 57 18

Thursday Dec 24th begins with
half a Gale from West Starboard
by the wind on the Starboard tack
Strong breeze later part so ends Lat 45 59 Long 57 33

Friday Dec 25th begins with
Strong breeze from W S W Steered by the
wind on the Starboard tack saw
Pobishon Island at 2 Pm were Ship at 4 Pm
were Ship again at 7 Am so ends
Lat 45 48 Long 57 28

Saturday Dec 26th Strong breeze
from W S W Steered by the wind on
the Starboard tack saw the Land at 4 Pm
were Ship at 7 Pm were Ship again at
7 Am more moderate later part
so ends Lat none Long 40

Sunday Dec 27th begins with
Strong breeze from West Steered
by the wind on the Starboard tack
til 4 Pm and were Ship in greater
after part saw a large school of sperm
Whales at 11-15 Am. Towed all four
Boats at 11-30 Am L. B. struck at 11-45
Am all four Boats struck gave minutes
so ends Lat none Long 40

Monday Dec 28th begins with
fair weather fresh breeze from E N E
at 10 minutes past 12 the Bow Boat
got stove Mr. George and his Boats
left the Stove Boat and tried to
swim to the Ship which was about
300 yards off Capt. Caldwell threw
the fore Peaches born plank and other
things overboard to save them everything
that was on that could be done but as
to no avail at half past 12 they all went
down to ride no more the L. B. got a Whale
turned up at 1 Pm the W Boat got 2 Whales
turned soon after S B got one turned
up at 3 Pm L. B. killed their Whale
and got aboard at 1-30 Pm were the
Ship to Windward took the S B Whale
4 Pm sun down got the W Boat
two Whales alongside at 6-40 Pm the L. B.
Whale was in sight one mile and a half
