

Thursday March 25<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather good breeze from ENE steered by the wind on the Starboard tack the watch employed Tiling fore part finished Tiling at 10 Pm saw one sail breeds Lat none

Friday March 26<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather breeze from East steered by the wind on the Port tack watch employed variously saw one sail breeds Lat 15 28 Long 37 27

Saturday March 27<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather good breeze from East steered by the wind on the Port tack saw a lot of Sperm Whales or what we supposed to be Whales at 5.30 Pm 7 miles off shortened sail at 6.30 and laid a back all hands employed latter part storm down the oil between decks all the Coaks were not full but it was about 60 Pbls breeds Lat 15 20 Long 37 33

Sunday March 28<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather pleasant breeze from SE steered by the wind on the Port tack till 6 Pm and tacked ship till keep going at daylight saw two sails breeds Lat 15 14 Long 37 27

Monday March 29<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather pleasant breeze from SE steered by the wind on the Port tack till 6 Pm and tacked ship tacked again at 4 Pm 4 Am saw two sails breeds and one Tompack breeds Lat 15 01 Long 37 10

Tuesday March 30<sup>th</sup> begins with fine weather pleasant breeze from ENE steered by the wind on Starboard tack till dark saw Sperm Whales at 5 P 6 or 7 miles off got within 5 miles of them at dark shortened sail and laid a back all night light breeze latter part saw two sails breeds Lat 15 27 Long 37 07

Wednesday March 31<sup>st</sup> begins with fine weather light breeze from East steered by the wind on the Port tack shortened sail at dark saw Sperm Whales at 11 Am lowered four Charles Brant steered the S L B at the S B struck at 2 30 Pm freed Lapoint headed the Bow Boat down

Thursday April 1<sup>st</sup> begins with fine weather pleasant breeze from East the L B struck at 2.30 Pm the Iron drewed out before there was a strain on the line S B struck a 50 Pbl Whale one minute after she struck she got stove most all to pieces W B struck at 4 P and killed the Whale L B struck again at 5 Pm killed him struck again killed him and another Coo's Whale got the W B Whale alongside at 6 Pm got the L B 3 Whales alongside at 8 Pm and set the watch began to cut out at daylight got the four Whales cut in at 11 Am began to chase away the heads and cut the blubber up breeds Lat 15 33 Long 37 33
