

Wednesday May 12th begins with
a Calm and hazy weather. Strong breeze
later part from West steered to the E & N E.
til 10 Am and closed reefed the Main
top sail and of luffed to the wind on the
Port tack to end Lat 38 00 Long 28 00

Thursday May 13th begins with strong
breeze from West E with some rain. laid
thore to under closed reefed Main top gave
part steered E & N E later part saw
nothing but Porpoises to end Lat 38 33 Long 28 41

Friday May 14th begins with
fresh breeze from N W steered S E saw
the Islands of Fajal and Pico at 4 Pm
steered for them til 6 Pm and luffed to the
wind saw the Land again at day light kept off
for Fajal got to the Gurn at 10 Am the Capt
went ashore Henry Hallas was discharged to say
Dick got one man from shore to end

Saturday May 15th begins with
fresh breeze from West the Capt came
aboard at 4 Pm with 500 Onions 24 Cabbages
and 65 lbs of Potatoes steered to the S E
saw the Land again at 10 Am to end
Lat 38 28 Long 28 40

Sunday May 16th begins with
strong breeze from West steered by the
wind on the Port tack under double
reefed top sail saw four or five Finbacks
to end Lat 39 16 Long 28 48
Lat 39 49 Long 29 18

Monday May 17th begins with
strong breeze from West steered
by the wind on the Port tack til
day light wore ship better weather later
part saw nothing to end Lat 39 26 Long 28 39

Tuesday May 18th begins with
breeze from West weather fresh breeze from
W & N W steered by the wind on the Starboard
tack til 4 Pm and tacked ship had it
some rainy later part to end Lat 39 26 Long 28 49

Wednesday May 19th begins with
fine weather good breeze from N W
steered by the wind saw the ship Com
Morris spoke her but Capt Crowell went
aboard at 6 Pm came aboard at 9 Pm saw
the Land later part to end Lat 39 22 Long 29 13

Thursday May 20th begins with
fine weather good breeze from W & N W
steered by the wind on the Port tack
Calm all the latter part Starboard Boat
went aboard the Bark Notes of Hamburg
for papers set but got none saw seven sails
to end Lat 39 50 Long 29 15

Friday May 21st begins with
fine weather pleasant breeze from West
steered by the wind on the Port tack
til noon and wore ship saw four or
five Finbacks and two sails
to end Lat 40 00 Long 30 00
