

Saturday May 22nd begins with fine weather light breeze from NW. Steered by the wind on the Starboard tack good breeze latter part saw the Islands of Corro and Flores at 6 PM 45 miles off So ends Lat 3948 Long 2920

Sunday May 23rd begins with fine weather good breeze from West Steered South till dark and luffed to the wind steered by the wind. The latter part So ends Lat 3831 Long 2940

Monday May 24th begins with fine weather good breeze from West Steered E S by till 10 PM kept off in the morning & for For Fayal to see if the officers had come and for letters got off the Coon at 10 AM the Capt went ashore So ends this day

Tuesday May 25th begins with good breeze from East found the officers ashore got the Anchors off the Board at 1 PM and came to an anchor at 6 PM began to hoist out the oil at daylight got 150 Bbls out coopered it and delivered it into a Lanch from Shore at 11 AM So ends this day

Wednesday May 26th begins with fair weather got all the oil out of the Hold at 5 PM and coopered a part of it Strong breeze latter part had it foggy and some rain got the Oil all coopered and some of the Ground tier Casks ready to stow So ends this day

Thursday May 27th begins with half a Gale from NW got the Oil all Coopered and ready to send ashore at 5 PM got the Ground tier partly stowed and filled with salt water began to set up hooks So ends this day

Friday May 28th begins with fine weather got the Ground tier all stowed and filled with salt water and set up six new Casks got 26 Casks of Sperm Oil ashore and one Cask of Black fish Oil that finished all the oil except four Bbls of Black fish oil remained on board So ends

Saturday May 29th begins with fine weather set up three Casks of Shook but the after Hold stowed off off the Main Hatch found two of our Casks were bad that was ashore bent in two Casks and two Bbls pumped them off into the good Casks So ends this day

Sunday May 30th begins with fine weather set up 4 or 5 Casks of Shooks stowed off the fore Hold &c So ends this day

Monday 31st 1869 begins with fine weather

Monday 31st came aboard and Mr. Strikney and Whaler went ashore, took aboard 4 cords Wood 2660 ^{lbs} Podatoes four thousand onions, one hundred and twenty Cabbages sent ashore and filled six Casks water employed stringing up the onions and cabbages discharged two Men in the hospital and John Moore went ashore and rem. for the hills
