 Tuesday June 1st took off our water and
 run it in tank, filled the Butt, from tank
 shipped four men and one Boatswain
 Mr. Tappan taking the fourth mate's place
 and took one man from foreable for
 Boatswain. At five p.m. got underway and
 laying off and on so ends this day

Wednesday June 2nd
 through the night laying aback between Fayal
 and Pico, at eight the Capt went ashore. Came aboard
 at eleven a.m., and so ends

Thursday June 3rd
 at twelve kept off and ran out the N side
 of Fayal, and hauled up N.W. with fine breeze
 from S.W. Spoke the schooner Abbie Brown boiling
 a large whale, stowed chains and anchors, and down
 up deck, put up 1 cask of lard and one barrel
 onions, latter part blowing on strong from S.W.
 Double reefed topsails and furlled courses. Boats
 all ready for whaling so ends this day

Friday June 4th
 commenced with fresh breeze and moderating, at five p.m.
 nearly calm. Flood bearing W. and ebb bearing N.W.
 by W. some light breeze. Steering by wind to N.W.
 through the night light winds with rain. at
 daylight saw the Islands in about the same position
 as at night, working up with all sail and wind
 N.W. and clear weather so ends

Saturday June 5th
 commenced with fresh breeze from N.W. to N.N.W. and
 clear weather, at four p.m. tacked within about
 four miles of the Island of Corvo and sent wait
 boat on, came aboard at seven, and took in topgallant
 sail, a strong current setting to E. working to windward between

Saturday June 5th
 the two Islands. latter part stood in to Corvo
 and Capt Caldwell went ashore, and ship
 working off and on, another Whaling Bark
 off and on at Flores. also saw the Orions at St. George

Sunday June 6th
 at half past two the Capt came aboard
 and a shore boat with 30 bushels Potatoes
 and two Bullock & killed one bullock, and
 at six p.m. stood off to seaward of Island
 wind N.W. and squally, through the night
 light winds and clear weather, latter part
 steering by wind to N. with all sail, Corvo in sight
 to S.W. had our Potatoes on deck drying so ends

Monday June 7th
 commenced with fresh breeze from N.W. and
 clear pleasant weather, steering by wind to N.
 several sail, in light steering to E.S.E., Middle part
 light breeze from same and squally, latter part
 the same. Broke out after hold for Molokai
 and opened Slaps so ends. Lat 41.15 Lon 31.59

Tuesday June 8th
 commenced with light breeze from W. and backed
 to S.W. with clear pleasant weather, steering to
 N.W. latter part took in sail, through the night
 part of light calm. at 12 Midnight wind sprang from
 E.S.E. and freshening, and slowly backing to N. latter part
 the same. Lat 41.52 Lon 32.35

Wednesday June 9th
 commenced with fresh breeze from N.W. and backed to N.
 and puffy, latter part double reefed, and wore ship at
 seven p.m. to E.N.E. — Close reefed at midnight close
 reefed blowing strong and wind came round to N.
 latter part moderating some, laying under main topgallant
 and staysail, second mate sick. Lat 41.40 Lon 32.16
