

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford
Saturday June 26th 1869

Commenced with light air from S. to S.E. and calm, lowered for kilters without success, at Sundown light breeze from S.E. heading to S.W. cleared down topsails and hauled up, covered light air through the night made sail through at daylight heading to S. by wind wind light from C.S.E. several sail in sight, lat 49.47 lon 20.50

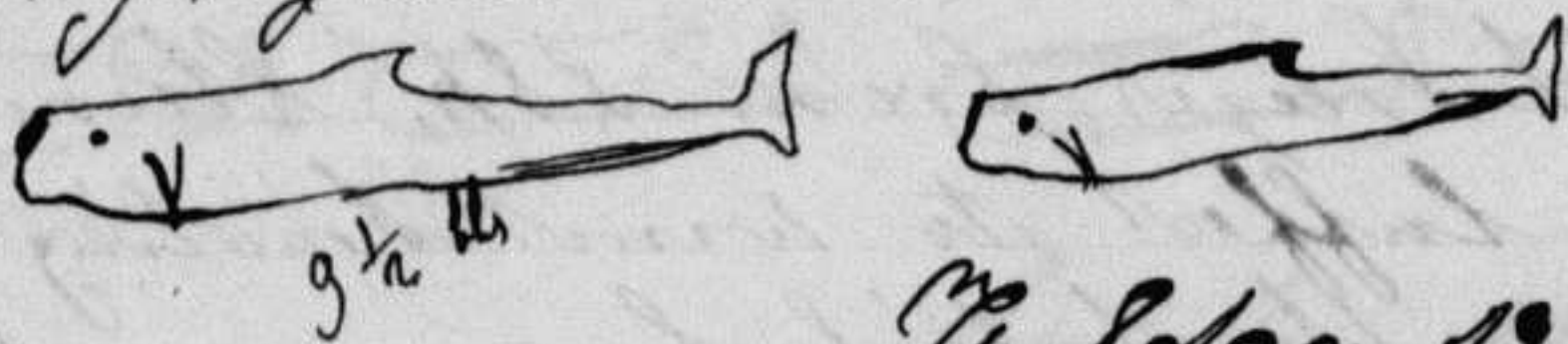
Sunday 27th

Light air from C.S.E. steering by wind to S. till seven p.m. when tacked to N.E. boarded the Steamer Cella from London for New York, sent letters by her picked up a large Spar. and caught a fish, opened four bait casks, forrest sails mildewed, through the night light air from C.S.E. heading by wind to N.E. at daylight raised and lowered for Blackfish, caught four, clearing them away Seend lat 50.62 lon 20.45



Monday 28th

Breeze freshening from C.S.E. heading by wind to S. missed Blackfish Blubber. several sail in sight through the night light breeze from same heading the same under topsails at four a.m. lowered for Blackfish caught two, cleared them away and commenced boiling steering by wind the same wind freshening lat 49.16 lon 20.50



Tuesday 29th

Commenced with fresh breeze from C. to C.S.E. steering by wind to S. finished boiling Blackfish several sail in sight, plenty of Sulphur Bottoms, through the night heading by wind to S.S.E. under topsails at seven a.m. tacked to N.E. one ship in sight have got off the Sulphur Bottom ground. have altered the color of water, have been in but very little blue water since leaving lat 49. Seend, lat 48.53 lon 19.59

Cruising in the North Atlantic
Wednesday June 30th 1869

Commenced with strong breeze from C. tack. ship at twelve, N. to S.S.E. wind heading her some have seen no signs of any kind of fish today. through the night heading to N.E. by wind under topsails at five a.m. were to S. strong breeze from C.S.E. through the day very poor seeing, at half past eleven were ship to N.E. saw one finback Seend lat 48.50 lon 19.51

Thursday July 1st 1869

Commenced with strong breeze from S.E. heading by wind to C.S.E. till seven p.m. were to S.S.W. at four a.m. were to C.S.E. and through the day heading by wind to C. to C.S.E. under double reefed topsails saw nothing but ships Seend lat 49.20 lon 18.58

Friday 2nd

Commenced with strong breeze from S.S.E. to S. and haze heading to C. under double reef till eight p.m. were to S.W. and heading the same till eleven a.m. when were to C.S.E. thick drizzly weather set for sail at five a.m. saw one ship stalked close to at bound W. Seend take observation

Saturday 3rd

Commenced with strong breeze from S. and freshening with thick weather, took in for sail at three p.m. were ship at seven p.m. to W. with thick rainy weather closed reefed topsails. made some sail at daylight, and at eight a.m. were to C. blowing on strong in a squall, were back to W. and laying too under close reefed main top sail and stay sail boiled out two porpoises and catching water.
