

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford

Monday July 12th 1869

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. and moderating, finished boiling beef and went on a little head that was left. Made sail and steering N.W. Cooled down at midnight and put the lean in the pot. Called all hands at four A.M. and stowing down, steering under all sail to N.W. lat 50.28 lon 18.42

Tuesday 13th

finished stowing our oil at four P.M. and washed ship, went along side of steamer Holblania, to put letters aboard, but she would not take any notice of me, was going so that nearly upset the boat, they never offered to throw a line. Steering to N.W. with all sail through the night and rest of day and so on. lat 49.21 lon 19.22

Wednesday 14th

Commenced with light breeze from N. steering N.W. sent new main topsail, at six P.M. steering by wind N.W. through the night calm. latter part light airs from E. by E. steering S.W. ~~at six P.M.~~ and so on. lat 49.00 lon 19.27

Thursday 15th

Commenced with light breeze from E. by E. and freshening and latter part E. steering S.W. till six P.M. when hauled on wind to S.E. and heading the same through the night under topsails, wore ship at daylight and made sail, wind E. by E. steering through the day N.E. lat 49.10 lon 19.31

Friday 16th

first part steering N.E. under all sail, with strong breeze from N.E. saw a number of sail, through the night steering by wind to E. by E. wore ship at daylight and steering by wind till seven A.M. then steering S.W. employed patching rigging. lat 49.20 lon 20.20

Cruising in the North Atlantic

Saturday July 17th 1869

Commenced with light breeze from E. and backing to N. and freshening saw several sailbacks steering N.W. then N.E. with all sail, through the night heading by wind to W. at daylight made sail, wind backing to S. tacked at six A.M. to W. and so on. lat 49.20 lon 20.20 boarded the ship Annette of St. Pauls, could not talk as they were french. from St. Pauls, N.Y. for St. Pauls

Sunday 18th

Commenced with wind from S.W. and foggy, heading by wind to W. wind hauling back, to north, at three P.M. wore ship to S. and clearing up some on through the night light breeze from same, latter part wore ship to N.W. boarded the ship Milton Lockhart, of R. Shields, for New York lat 48.48 lon 20.58

Monday 19th

fresh breeze from S.W. and pleasant plenty of ship in light breeze from E. steering by wind to N.W. through the night and rest of the day latter part blowing on strong furlled sails and close reefed topsails and so on. started water from after hold.

Tuesday 20th

Commenced with fresh gale from S.W. and thick smoky weather and some wet fog furlled foretop sail heading by wind to W. through the night strong breeze from same with rain and fog, wore ship at seven A.M. and thick haze weather lat 49.54 lon 21.24

Wednesday 21st

first part strong breeze from S.W. steering to S.E. by wind lay through the night and the same and latter part hauling to W. and squally, heading by wind to S.W. under short sail and doing nothing lat 48.44 lon 21.58
