

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford
Sunday September 5th 1869
latter part light breeze from E. Steering to S.
till seven A.M. then steering S.W.

Monday 6th
Commenced with light breeze from E. Steering
S.W. then wore and steering N. the Sterns of
Rio and Fagal bearing from N by E. to E. twenty miles
took in sail at sunset. Made sail at daylight
with light breeze from S. steering N by E. the land
some twenty miles distant. Setting up shrouds

Tuesday 7th
Commenced with light breeze from S. and hauling to
N. S.W. setting up shrouds. lowered for killest without
succeed took in sail at sunset heaving by wind to N. S.W.
squally, latter part strong breeze from W. running
towards Fagal. came on thick and wind came
out N. in a squall luffed to wind.

Wednesday 8th
Kept off again with clear weather and light
breeze from N. Run in wind freshening and
squally. See that the Fredonia was not there
and run off to N. and at sunset luffed to
wind under short sail. heading N. S.W.
latter part fresh breeze from N.W. kept
off for the harbor of Fagal.

Thursday 9th
Commenced with strong breeze from N.W.
Came to an anchor at four P.M. So enot's
sent raft larks ashore and painting ship
took harbor boat on deck and denailing
her

painting ship and filled raft water which
cant bring off till get the oil out, painting
ship, &

Saturday 11th
Sent one watch on liberty breaking out
and stowing ground in after hold. and
filling with salt water blowed all we had ashore
for.

Sunday 12th
one watch on liberty

Monday 13th
One watch on liberty, painting and stowing off
after hold. Strong breeze from W. S.W. let go second
anchor

Tuesday 14th
One watch on liberty. doing odd jobs, painting
boats & latter part hove up second anchor

Wednesday 15th
Blowing strong from S.W. let go second anchor
the Fredonia arrived to day. blowing heavy till
about midnight when it commenced raining.

Thursday 16th
Fine weather with wind W. hove up second anchor
looked sails, &c

Friday 17th
Sent one watch ashore and doing odd jobs

Saturday 18th
One watch ashore
Sunday 19th
Staped the liberty as they overstayed their time
one man Philip Silva run away

Monday 20th
Raining all day hove up second anchor and cleaned it
