Thursday March 17th 1870.

employed getting wood, and water and
stowing it in after hold. Reeled the ship and
repaired copper on port side.

Friday 18th.

employed getting wood and stowing water
and Provision in after hold.

Saturday 19th

Employed getting wood and water and stowing
it away &.

Sunday 20th

All hands ashore, and at night several of them
being drunk, had some trouble in getting them on
board.

Monday 21st

Employed getting off wood and water, got four
cows aboard, and stowed it in main hold, heard
that one boatsteerer and a man was going to run
to night, the same that were so troublesome last night
put them in irons to night.

Tuesday 22nd

Employed getting off wood, water, and Potatoes, ad
soon as the last was aboard got underway and
at dark was some eight miles from the harbor
steering N.W. with strong breeze from N.E. the
Pacific dropped anchor just as we commenced
leaving, stowed anchor and chains and cleared deck.

Wednesday 23rd

Strong breeze from N.E. through the night, steering
to N.W. through the day passed several islands
and at dark wind N.E. the Island of Easterland
bearing N. part N. some twelve miles, and Saba
W part that can be N.W. ~~then~~ some twenty miles
steering N.W. at two p.m. lat 17° 10' lon 62° 47'

Cruising in the North Atlantic

Thursday March 24th 1870

Strong breeze from E. steering N. by W. then
N. part N. main top sail sheet, at twelve m.
the Island of Sombrea bearing E. ten miles.
saw several vessels bound in the passage at two p.m.
lat 18° 50' lon 63° 42'

Friday 25th

Fresh breeze from E. steering N. with all sail
employed repairing spanker run off for
a short that proved to be a fair back but
spanker. at two p.m. lat 21° 18' lon 64° 08'

Saturday 26th

Fresh breeze from E. and pleasant
steering N. by E. employed repairing
fore staysail, at two p.m. lat 23° 10' lon 64° 09'

Sunday 27th

Light breeze from S.E. with swell from
N.W. to N. steering N. by E. and N.E. by N.
at two p.m. lat 24° 10' lon 63° 50'

Monday 28th

Fresh breeze from S. to S.E. steering N.E.
employed repairing fore staysail, a swell
from N. at two p.m. lat 25° 35' lon 62° 54'

Tuesday 29th

Fresh breeze from S.W. steering N. employed
on sails, latter part squally and wind
hanging to W. N.W. steering N. by E.
at two p.m. lat 27° 20' lon 61° 49'

Wednesday 30th

Strong breeze from N.W. steering from
N.E. to E. N.E. with all sail, opened by latter.
lowered and finked up part of a small catk yellow
made over a barrel saw two vessels bound S. at two p.m.
lat 27° 25' lon 60° 12'
