

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford
Thursday, March 31st 1870
Strong gales from W. with heavy swell from
N.W. kept off E. and same through day
at two p.m. lat 39.20 lon 57.55 W

Friday April 1st 1870
Fresh gales from N.W. and clear. Steering E.
under double reefed topsail. Saw one sail
bound W. at dark close reefed Main topsail
and luffed to wind, at two p.m. lat 39.35 lon 58.15

Saturday 2nd
Commenced with strong breeze from N. and
moderating. latter part fresh breeze from
same and pleasant. Steering E. at two p.m. lat 39.52
lon 58.36

Sunday 3rd
Light breeze from E. and calm, heading
by wind to S.E. till noon wore ship to N.
at sundown took in sail at two p.m. lat 39.42
lon 58.01

Monday 4th
Fresh breeze from S.E. and pleasant. Steering
N.E. with all sail. Men employed variously
carried sail through the night at two p.m.
lat 39.30 lon 58.29

Tuesday 5th
Commenced with fresh breeze from S.E. and
pleasant latter part strong breeze from same and
thick cloudy. Saw white water just at night, called
it Grampius, water green. at sunset double reefed
and steering N.E. at two p.m. lat 39.30 lon 58.50

Wednesday 6th
Strong breeze from S. and cloudy latter part
some rain and wind working to N.W. took in
sail and luffed to wind to S.E. Steering N.E. by E
through the day

Cruising in the North Atlantic
Thursday April 7th 1870
Commenced with fresh breeze from S.W. kept
off E.N.E. till two p.m. steering N. saw several
sloops, carrying sail through the night.
steering N. at two p.m. lat 36.00 lon 48.31

Friday 8th
Fresh gales from S.W. with fog and rain
steering N. at four p.m. furled foresail, and
running under close reefed Main and double reefed
fore topsail. No observation. So ends

Saturday 9th
Commenced with fresh breeze from N. and heading
to N.E. with some rain. at noon cleared off
pleasant. wore ship to N. N.W. and latter part
calm. So ends at two p.m. lat 39.18 lon 50.02

Sunday 10th
Fresh breeze from N. and squally. saw two
sail bound E. latter part lowered for
Blackfish. Struck one and drewed. heading
through the day by wind to E.N.E. wore round
at five p.m. to N.W. and carrying sail through
the night. at two p.m. lat 39.16 lon 49.35

Monday 11th
Wore ship at four A.M. to E.N.E. Strong breeze
through the day from N. to N.E. calking decks
E & wore ship to N. N.W. at six p.m. wind S.E.
and so ends at two p.m. lat 38.58 lon 48.52

Tuesday 12th
With part wind came out E. and light. at
daylight steering N. with fine weather and
all sail. Saw plenty of Sloop, lent down fore
topsail, and sent up the other. Wore one at sunset luffed
to wind and shortened sail, wind N.E. and breezy. lat 38.58 lon 48.44
