

Bark Mary Hazier of New Bedford

Wednesday April 13th 1870

Strong breeze from S. and thick weather. Kept off at daylight steering N. at eleven a.m.uffed to wind to E.S.E. at four p.m. wore ship and close reefed main top sail and furlled fore, to ends, no one killed a pig

Thursday 14th

Strong breeze from S.W. with rain and fog, heading to W. till three p.m. wore ship to S.E. wind moderating with heavy swell from S.W. thick fog, no obs.

Friday 15th

Strong breeze from S.W. and thick hazy weather wore ship at seven a.m. to N.W. and wore back at ten. latter part took in sail heading by wind to S. at two p.m. lat 42.10 lon 47.07

Saturday 16th

Commenced with strong breeze from W. with some rain, let fth & coursed. steering by wind to S.W. at nine a.m. wind came out N.E. in a squall and steering S.W. till twelve (noon) took in all sail but close reefed main top sail and luffed to wind to E.S.E. latter blowing fresh from same with some rain squalls.

Sunday 17th

Commenced with strong breeze from E.S.E. with thick cloudy weather steering by wind to S. under close reefed top sails and stay sails, latter part moderating some, so ended at two p.m. lat 40.32 lon 46.37

Monday 18th

First part strong breeze from E.S.E. heading by wind to S. Middle part some rain, wind hauled to S.W. and moderating. latter part clear pleasant weather, made all sail. at sunset took in light sail and wore ship to E. wind light from S.E. towards

Cruising in the North Atlantic

Tuesday, April 19th 1870

Light wind from S.S.W. and pleasant through the day. steering to S.E. employed on rigging, have four men off duty. sick, at sunset took in sail and heading to S.E. at two p.m. lat 39.48 lon 45.28

Wednesday 20th

Commenced with light breeze from S.S.W. and pleasant, steering E.S.E. wind freshening through the day, at four p.m. double reefed top sails and furlled cross beam, and luffed to wind at five p.m. so ended at two p.m. lat 39.56 lon 43.05 to S.E.

Thursday 21st

Commenced with strong breeze from N.S.W. and blowing on and on to a strong gale, wind working to N.W. latter part moderating let double reefed top sails, and heading to E.S.E. by wind. Wind N. Sea going down, quick

Friday 22nd

First part light breeze from N.E. steering by wind to E.S.E. at ten a.m. clewed up and down latter part light ^(variable) wind and calm, employed darning sail, at two p.m. lat 39.20 lon 42.34

Saturday 23rd

Fresh breeze from S.W. under foresail to mend it. steering latter part of night E by N lowered at six o'clock a.m. for Blackfish, without success steering through the day E. to E.S.E. took off topmast stay sail to put on foresail, bent it at dark, and took in sail wore ship to N.W. at two p.m. lat 39.40 lon 41.51

Sunday 24th

Fresh breeze from S. through the day steering W. till half past nine a.m. wore ship steering E.S.E. took in sail at sunset steering by wind to E.S.E. saw two sail and furlled at two p.m. lat 40.15 lon 41.23
