

Bark Mary Carrier of New Bedford
 Sunday June 12th 1870
 through the night blowing strong from S.W.
 First part moderating started the works at
 daylight, but with the good scraps make slow
 boiling have the junk near all out. So ends
 at two p.m. lat 50.28 lon 25.41

Monday 13th
 First part strong breeze from W. with some rain
 finished boiling head, and boiling lean. Middle
 and latter part blowing strong and clear.
 Stowed what oil was cool, and have some on
 deck yet. Sailing with head to S.W. with strong
 breeze from W. to W.N.W. So ends lat at noon 50.33

Tuesday 14th
 Strong gale from W. heading by wind to S. till
 noon when wore ship to N. and stowing down.
 took a cask out of ground tier that was not
 full of water. could find no leak. Stowed it
 back and filled it with oil. have the oil all
 down but lean. whale made 125. lat at noon 50.08

Wednesday 15th
 Strong breeze from N.W. and squally. Steering
 by wind to N. boiling flaked and washed ship
 broke out meat &c. So ends at two p.m. lat 49.28 lon 22.30

Thursday 16th
 Strong breeze from N.W. and hauling to
 N. Saw whales at seven a.m. going sharp
 on a wind covered at eight, but could not keep
 up with them came aboard at eleven, lowered again at
 three p.m. and ship galled them and thick rain
 storm. Let them and came aboard and lowered again
 at half past six p.m. whale close to ship. Boat struck, bow
 boat got fast and whale sporting blood when took both
 did not see him again. might have died close to us in fog
 and took the boat up at eight and heading by wind to S.

Cruising on Commodore Morris Ground
 Friday June 17th 1870
 First part strong breeze from W. and foggy
 making six hour tacks. Latter part wind
 moderating some and fog cleared off at
 six p.m. saw nothing. Hauled fish stay and
 set it up. coiling lines &c. So ends

Saturday 18th
 Strong breeze from S.W. to W. with some fog
 standing to S.E. till seven a.m. then steering
 by wind to N.W. saw nothing. No weather
 to see or do anything. we lost ~~some~~ fathoms line
 one lance. and two iron drags & Pokes. boats
 all ready. again, at two p.m. lat 48.14 lon 21.13

Sunday 19th
 Wore ship at five a.m. to S. with fresh breeze
 from N.W. and middle part light air from
 same. Some fog through first part and latter part
 thick fog. wore ship at half past five p.m. to N.W.
 and So ends

Monday 20th
 First part fog with fresh breeze from S.W. wore ship
 at three a.m. to S.E. latter part clearing up. Some
 wind freshening and working to W. tacked at four
 p.m. to N.W. saw a steamer bound W. to ends
 at two p.m. lat 48.16 lon 20.11

Tuesday 21st
 Clear pleasant weather through the day, with the
 wind from N.W. to N. heading by wind to W.
 with all sail saw nothing. at two p.m. lat 48.12 lon 20.57

Wednesday 22nd
 Strong breeze from N.E. wore ship at twelve midnight
 to E. wore back at eight a.m. to N.W. and so through
 the day. saw Porpoises & Blackfish water green latter
 part took in some sail. at two p.m. lat 48.06 lon 21.13
