

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford

Tuesday July 26th 1870

First part strong breeze from S.W. steering to N.W. by E. Middle part breezing on strong and set in main. latter part how too head to N.W. So ended Thursday

Wednesday 27th

Fresh breeze from N.W. to N. and growing light tacked ship to W. then back to E.N.E. and so ended. Sent down fore top gallant sail and stowed it away. Saw two sail. At two p.m. lat 46.25 lon 21.28

Thursday 28th

Light air from N.E. to E. and calm. Steered by wind to N.W. then to N.E. saw one sail. Repaired fore top gallant sail and stowed it away. So ended. At two p.m. lat 46.33 lon 21.55

Friday 29th

Light breeze from S.E. to S.W. and clear pleasant weather. Steering to E by N. till six p.m. steering N. So ended at two p.m. lat 47.15 lon 20.35

Saturday 30th

First part fresh breeze from S. to S.W. and cloudy. Steering to E. till noon. then steering N.W. till five p.m. wind came out N.W. raining and breezing. heading by wind to N.E. bore new reefables at fore and main.

Sunday 31st

Raining enough through the night to fill all our Butts. First part of day light air from S.W. and calm. At ten a.m. breeze sprang from S. and backing to S.E. steering to N.W. till two p.m. steering N.E. latter part wind N.E. saw a number of ships. At two p.m. lat 48.20 lon 19.09

Cruising in the North Atlantic

Monday, August 1st 1870.

First part calm, and light air from N. cleared up and down. Sent in fore and aft part it and sent it out again latter part made sail light breeze from N. heading to N.W. till seven p.m. wore ship to E. carrying sail through the night so ended. At two p.m. lat 48.30 lon 19.45

Tuesday 2nd

Strong breeze from W. backing to S.W. and came on foggy. Steering by wind to N.W. latter part wind moderating and hauling to W. and clearing off wore ship at four p.m. to S. No sail

Wednesday 3rd

Strong breeze from N.W. to N. with frequent squalls heading to S.W. with close reefed top sails and staysails. Several sail passed behind E. took the lee boat up and craft out of them. At two p.m. lat 48.15 lon 19.48

Thursday 4th

Strong gale from N.W. to N. blowing heavy through the night. with rain squalls. through the day a bad sea but not as much wind. latter part moderately laying on starboard tack head to W. with two close reefed top sails. So ended at two p.m. lat 47.12 lon 19.48

Friday 5th

First part fresh breeze from N.W. and backing to N.E. and fog. wore ship at ten a.m. to N.W. and wore back at seven p.m. to S. thick fog and so ended

Saturday 6th

First part blowing on strong from N.W. close reefed fore top sail, and farled fore sail. Middle part set fore and main sail. blowing strong. heading to S.W. by wind through the day. At two p.m. lat 46.00 lon 20.08
