

Bark Mary Frazier of New Bedford.

Thursday, September 8th 1870
 Strong breeze from W. through the day steering
 by wind to S.W. with double reefed topsails
 and courses. Carrying sail through the night
 saw Grampus, and one sail so endd lat 41.58
 lon 22.58

Friday 9th
 First part wind hauling to W. and moderating at
 ten A.M. clewed up and down, light air and hauling
 to E. and breezing a little set main top sail and steering
 W.N.W. commencing to rain at seven P.M. so endd.
 At two P.M. lat 45.27 lon 22.59

Saturday 10th
 At three A.M. wind came out E. and blowing
 strong steering W.N.W. till seven A.M. steering
 W.S.W. some rain through the night blowing
 strong through the day and wind backing
 to N.E. at two P.M. lat 46.40 lon 24.51

Sunday 11th
 Fine weather with light breeze from E.N.E. steering
 to W.S.W. and latter part W. Saw a number
 of sail bound E. so endd at two P.M. lat 50.54
 lon 26.56

Monday 12th
 First part light breeze from S. and freshening
 latter part fresh from S.W. steering by wind
 to W. at sunset double reefed topsails and
 so endd. Saw several sail bound E. at two P.M. lat 52.20
 lon 27.53

Tuesday 13th
 Fine weather with light breeze from S.W. steering
 by wind to W. till two P.M. wore ship to S.E. for
 what proved to be Grampus. tacked back at seven
 P.M. carrying sail. Spoke the American ship Lophoceros
 employed about ship. At two P.M. lat 40.10
 lon 28.57

Cruising in the North Atlantic

Wednesday, September 14th 1870
 Light wind from W. and calms. laying clewed
 up and down, and so endd. employed on
 rigging at two P.M. lat 39.50 lon 29.15

Thursday 15th
 Light air from S. through the day. Made
 sail at nine A.M. and steering by wind to W.
 picked up a spar. and cut it up and
 caught a turtle and two fish. At sunset
 clewed up and down. At two P.M. lat 39.41 lon 28.58

Friday 16th
 Light breeze from S. Made sail in the night
 steering by wind to W.S.W. Middle part saw
 Flores & Corvo, to W. some forty to fifty miles
 latter part tacked to S.E. wind freshening
 hauled starboard chain on deck to try and
 get the iron pin out of shackle. so endd.
 At two P.M. lat 39.17 lon 29.34

Saturday 17th
 First part strong breeze from S. to S.W. steering
 by wind to S.E. till noon. tacked to W.S.W. latter
 part wind came out N.W. tacked at six P.M.
 and steering S.W. Foggy. bearing S by W. forty
 miles. hauled ship inside, and so endd.
 At two P.M. lat 39.18 lon 28.40

Sunday 18th
 Fresh breeze from N. W. in and anchored
 in Fayal, at eight A.M. with both anchors
 hauled all the chain on deck and heaving
 with fifty fathoms on each. so endd.

Monday 19th one watch on liberty so endd
