Tuesday Jan 9th 64
Begins with moderate winds from S.E. with good weather Ship Under all sail heading S.W. Middle part Wind & Weather the same. Latter part Moderate breeze from N.E. with good weather. Lat 33:16 Long 30:44

Wednesday Jan 10th 65
Begins with light breeze from N.E. with fine weather Ship Under all sail steering S.E. One sail in sight Bowed South Middle & Latter parts Wind the same with cloudy weather & some Rain No Obs

Thursday Jan 11th 66
Begins with light winds from N.E. with cloudy weather. Steering S.E. Under all sail Middle & Latter parts strong breeze & good weather Lat 36:30 Long 28:44

Friday Jan 12th 67
Begins with strong breeze from N.E. with good weather Ship Under all sail steering S.E. by S. Middle & Latter parts Wind & Weather the same At 7 A.M. saw Right Whale, and lowered four Boats in chase and struck one to the Starboard Boat. Soon after struck one to the Starboard Boat and turned them both up So Ends
Latitude 37:30 Long 26:27

Saturday Jan 13th 68
Begins with moderate breeze from N.E. with good weather At 6 P.M. got both Whales to the Ship, took in sail and set the Watches for the Night. At day light strong breeze from same quarter with thick weather and some Rain commenced cutting So Ends

Cutting, Sunday Jan 14th 69
Begins with strong winds from North East with thick Rainy weather. Wind increasing, At 8 P.M. finished Cutting and set the Watches Middle & Latter parts Moderate Gale from S.E. and steady Rain commenced Boiling

Monday Jan 15th 70
Begins with moderate Gale from South with steady Rain. Ship Hove to Under Storm sail Boiling. Middle & Latter parts Wind & Weather the same

Tuesday Jan 16th 71
Begins with the Wind moderating & weather clearing Emp Boiling Middle part the Wind hauled to N.E. & N. with strong breeze & Rugged, with steady pouring Rain, Latter part the same Trying to keep the Works going to save what Oil we can

Wednesday Jan 17th 72
Begins with Wind North & steady Rain At sunset the Wind hauled to West with every appearance of better weather. Ship on the P.W. back, Emp Boiling Middle & Latter parts light breeze from West with fine weather, made some sail & steered off to the N.E. Emp Boiling & Stowing Oil Lat 38.30 Long 28.27

Thursday Jan 18th 73
Begins with light breeze from the Westward & good weather, Steering off to N.E. Emp Boiling Middle & Latter parts same At 8 A.M. finished Boiling At 10 lowered for a Right Whale without success So Ends
