Monday March 11th 126

This day begins with light breeze from S.W. With Pleasant weather. Ship Under all sail steering S.E. by E half East. Middle & Latter parts fresh breeze from West to N.W. With good weather Course the same. Lat 38:50 Long 65:22

Tuesday March 12th 127

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. With good weather. Ship Under all sail steering S.E. by E half East. Middle part the same. Latter part Calm with fine weather So Ends

Wednesday March 13th 128

Begins Calm, at 3 P.M. Light breeze sprang up from East, at Clark strong breeze from East with Rainy weather Ship Under all sail on the Southerly tack. Middle & Latter parts strong breeze from E.N.E. With good weather Lat 39:40 Long 68:06

Thursday March 14th 129

Begins with strong breeze from East. With good weather. Ship heading S.E. with all sail out. Middle & Latter parts strong winds from East to N.E. with cloudy weather Ship on different tacks working to Eastward

Friday March 15th 130

Begins with strong breeze from N.E. with cloudy weather Ship Under all sail heading E.S.E. Middle & Latter parts Wind & weather the same

Saturday March 16th 131

Begins with moderate breeze from North with fine Pleasant weather. Ship Under all sail steering East. Lat 39:55 Long 72:35 Middle & Latter parts Wind & weather the same Lat 39:20 Long 73:22

Remarks Sunday March 17th 132

This day begins with light breeze from N.W. With Pleasant weather. Ship Under all sail steering East half South Middle part Wind the same, Latter part, Moderate Wind from S.W. With fine weather. Lat 38:55 Long 75:42

Monday March 18th 133

Begins with good breeze from S.W. With good weather. Ship Under all sail, steering E.S.E. at 4 P.M. was ninety miles from the Island of St. Pauls, by Observation. Middle part, fresh breeze from South with fine weather. At day light the Island right ahead, 10 miles distant, at 7 A.M. sent two Boats, Fishing, but the Wind fell to nearly Calm, and the Ship drifted off so fast, that at 10 o'clock went on board & kept away for the Island of Amsterdam So Ends

Tuesday March 19th 134

Begins with light breeze from South, with fine weather. Ship Under all sail, steering for the Island of Amsterdam, the Island in sight, bearing N.N.E. distant 30 miles. Middle & Latter parts, Moderate breeze from S.W. with Lowery weather. At 6 A.M. sent four Boats in to the Island Fishing, So Ends

Wednesday March 20th 135

Begins with moderate breeze from S.W. with Cloudy weather & some fine Rain, Ship Laying off & on the Island, and four Boats a Fishing. At 4 P.M. the Boats returned to the Ship with a good catch of Fish. Middle part Calm Latter part light airs from the Eastward, with fine weather, no Wind to go on our course so sent three Boats in to the Island to catch some more Fish So Ends
