With clear weather & Bugged. Ship Under
Reefed Top sails & Stay sails, heading E. S. E.
at 4 P.M. wore ship to W. S. W. Weather moderating
some, Middle part, wind died out to Calm
Latter part light breeze from S. W. with good
weather. Lat 34:36 Long 1.11:00

Tuesday April 23rd 169
Begins with fresh breeze from S. W. with good
weather. Ship Under all sail steering
S. E. by South. Middle & latter parts, wind
the same with Rainy weather. Course the
same

Wednesday April 24th 170
Begins with good breeze from S. W. with
thick weather. Steering E. S. E. Under Top sails
and Courses, at dark shortened sail
Middle & latter parts, wind the same with
good weather, Cruising. Lat 36:21 Long 1.15:43

Thursday April 25th 171
Begins with strong breeze from S. W. with clear
weather Ship Under Top sails & Courses, Cruising
at dark shortened sail. Middle & latter parts
Moderate Gale from S. W. to W. with squally weather
stunning off from East to South No End

Friday April 26th 172
Begins with Moderate Gale from West with
thick squally weather Ship Under Reefed Top
sails & Fore Course, steering from East to South
Saw the Coast of New Holland, bearing from N. E. to
North, 25 miles distant at dark came to heading
S. W. by S and close reefed the Main Top sail
Middle & latter parts, wind moderates to
Calm, with thick Fog & Rainy
No Ends

Saturday April 27th 173
Begins with light air from various quarters
with thick weather and plenty of Rain,
Middle part the same. Latter part strong wind
from West with clear weather Ship Under Top
sails & Courses Cruising Lat 36:40 Long 1.17:05

Sunday April 28th 174
Begins with strong Westerly winds & fair
weather Ship Under Top sails & Courses
Cruising Middle & latter parts nearly Calm
with thick Hazy weather and some Rain

Monday April 29th 175
Begins with strong wind from South, with
squally Rainy weather Ship Under short
sail Cruising Middle & latter parts Fresh
Gale from South with heavy squalls, Ship on the
S. E. tack Hove too Under Storm sail So Ends
Lat 36:31 Long 1.17:30

Tuesday April 30th 176
Begins with Gale from South, with squally weather
Ship Hove too on the Starboard tack heading S. E. by E.
Middle part wind & weather the same, latter part
more moderate, made some sail & wore ship to
W. S. W.

Wednesday May 1st 177
Begins with Moderate Gale from South with squally
weather & Bugged. Ship Under Reefed top sails and
Fore Course, at dark shortened sail and wore ship
to E. S. E. Middle part the same, latter part strong
breeze from S. S. E. with fair weather. Made all sail
Lat 35:17 Long 1.17:55

Thursday May 2nd 178
Begins with Moderate breeze from S. S. E. with good
weather stood in for the Land and made Bald Head
bearing North, 30 miles distant
Middle part wind the same So Ends Sea time
