

13th, Mary Frasier of New Bedford Mass

Thursday May 2nd Civil Time 178
Begins with Moderate breeze from South with
Rainy Weather Ship Under all sail standing in
for the Land. At 11 o'clock took a Pilot, At 12 M
Came to anchor in Albany, being Georges Sound
in 5 fathoms Water, with best anchor and 40
fathoms of Cable. Afternoon Broke out Shooks
and began setting up Casks.

Friday May 3rd 179
This twenty four hours nearly Calm with fine
Weather, Employed setting up Shooks, Pumping
Ground Tier. Washing Ship Outside, Etc Etc

Saturday May 4th 180
This day, light breeze from South. With good Weather
Employed same as yesterday & Blacking the Bends
Shifting Bread

Sunday May 5th 181
This day light breeze from South, with good
good Weather, Sent the men on Liberty. At Night
Barney Booker, Boatsteerer: Frank Bowers, Feark
Stevens, John Shenosky, John Flinn, Seamen and
Henry Graves, Martin Blair Cristian Edlison. David
Roberts. Joseph Mowsey & Joseph Lopez Green Hands
did not come on board. Supposed have deserted.

Monday May 6th 182
This day light breeze from S.E. with good weather
This Morning Caught Joseph Lopez and him on
Board. Employed Shifting Water in Fore Hold & Stowing
back again

Tuesday May 7th 183
This day begins fair & calm, all busy at work at
various jobs. After noon strong breeze & squally
from South with Rain at dark Weather same
and continued through the Night

Wednesday May 8th 184
This day Strong Wznds from South with squally
Rainy Weather, Sent a Raft of Water Casks on Shore
and filled them, but it was too rugged to bring
them off. At dark Wind & Weather the same.
To day, heard that the Police had caught, Six of our
Men, At 10 P.M. the Police Boat came alongside with
A David Robert, Joseph Mowsey, Martin Blair, John
Shenosky, Cristian Edlison and Frank Bowers
Six of the Deserters.

Thursday May 9th 185
This day strong Wind from W. with squally weather
and Rain Nothing Doing at dark Weather some-
better with signs of better tomorrow. Midnight, some
heavy squalls from S.W. with Rain. Let go the Second
Anchor

Friday May 10th 186
This day Weather rather better, but still squally, got
off a Raft of Water & Stowed it away, and other
jobs, Hove up the Second Anchor

Saturday May 11th 187
This day light breeze from different quarters. With good Weather
Got off two Rafts of Water, Stowed it away, and Painted
one Side of the Ship, Cooper at Work Repairing the Head
Rails of the Ship

Sunday May 12th 188
Begins with strong breeze from East with fair weather
Sent ten Men on Liberty, At Night all came on board

Monday May 13th 189
This day strong breeze from S.W. with fair weather, Stowed
down some Water, Sent 11 Men on Liberty, and Painted Ship
outside. At Night the Men all returned to the Ship
