Tuesday June 4th 211
 Begins with strong breeze from S.W. and
 squally. With heavy swell & rugged with clear
 weather. Ship under reefed topsails plowing
 N.W. At 3 P.M. Saw sperm whales going quick
 to windward. Lowered four boats & chased
 until sunset without success. At sunset
 Southeast Island in sight bearing N.W.
 Middle part wind died out to calm. Latter
 part light breeze from N.W. with good weather

Wednesday June 5th 212
 Begins with good breeze from N.W. with good
 weather. Ship under all sail Cruising
 one sail in sight to windward. Middle and
 latter parts wind & weather the same
 Lat 35:20 Long 124:10

Thursday June 6th 213
 Begins with light air from N.W. with fine
 weather. Ship under all sail Cruising. Three
 sails in sight. Bark Mermaid, Boiling, at
 sunset spoke the Bk Swallow, of New Bedford,
 Ryder Master, 35 months from home with
 1000 bbls oil. Middle part calm. Latter part
 smart breeze from N.W. with good weather.

Friday June 7th 214
 Begins with moderate breeze from N.W. with good
 weather. Ship under all sail Cruising. Middle
 & latter parts light breeze from East with good
 weather

Saturday June 8th 215
 Begins with fresh breeze from East with fine
 weather. Ship under all sail Cruising. Five sails
 in sight. Southeast Island bearing N by E. 10.
 miles distant. Middle & latter parts strong
 breeze from N.E. with good weather

Sunday June 9th 216
 This day begins with strong breeze from
 N.E. with good weather. Ship under all
 sail Cruising. Middle & latter parts. Wind &
 weather the same. Six sails in during the day

Monday June 10th 217
 Begins with strong breeze from N.E. with good
 whaling weather. Ship under all sail, Cruising
 Middle & latter parts. Strong winds from N.E.
 with rugged weather. Ship under reefed topsails
 & courses on different Tacks

Tuesday June 11th 218
 Begins with strong winds from N.E. with
 rugged weather. Ship under reefed topsails and
 courses. Cruising in sight of Southeast Island.
 Middle & latter parts wind & weather the same

Wednesday June 12th 219
 Begins with moderate wind from N.W. with
 rainy weather & lightning all around the
 horizon. Shortened sail to reefed topsails
 at dark raining fast with plenty of thunder
 & lightning and nearly calm. Middle part
 the weather cleared, with strong breeze from N.W.
 latter part the same. Saw two sails to windward
 Whaling So Ends

Thursday June 13th 220
 Begins with strong breeze from N.W. with good
 weather. Ship under all sail beating to windward
 Whales in sight with the boats of two ships in chase
 We had no chance, and did not lower.
 Middle part wind quite moderate. Latter part
 strong breeze from N.W. and squally with
 signs of bad weather
