Windward, Ship beating to Windward

X Saturday June 6th 243
Begins with good breeze from N.W. with good
weather Ship Under all sail working to Windward
at 3 P.M. Lowered Two Boats for the Whales, but
they were badly galled & could not come up with
them, Middle part strong breeze & Rainy weather
Saw the Two Barks Cutting, Middle & Latter parts
good breeze from N.W. with Hazy weather, Steering
of to the Eastward, Southeast & Round Islands
in sight to the S. Lat 34:07

Sunday July 7th 244
Begins with strong breeze from N.W. with Hazy
weather Ship Under all sail Cruising Middle
& Latter parts the same, with Squally weather, Ship
Under Topsails & Courses, at 12 P.M. Lowered
Two Boats for Sperm Whales; Struck one to the
Waist Boat, & lost the line, Lat 34:30 Long 124:00

Monday July 8th 245
Begins with weather the same, Chased the
Whales until sunset, but could not strike
Middle & Latter parts Moderate Gale from S.W. &
& Squally with rain Ship Under close Reefed
Topsails & Stay sails on the Western tack.

Tuesday July 9th 246
Begins with fresh Gale from North, with heavy
Squalls, Ship Under close Reefed main Topsail
& Stay sails heading N.W. Middle & Latter parts
heavy Gale from S.W. with heavy Squalls. Ship
Move to heading N.W. So Ends

Begins with fresh Gale from S.W. with heavy
Squalls of hail. Ship Move to heading S.E. & E.
Middle part more moderate, Latter part, strong
winds from W.N.W. with fair weather, Made
all sail Lat 34:41 Long 125:19

Thursday July 11th 248
Begins with moderate breeze from W.N.W.
with good weather. Ship Under all sail
Cruising. Middle part the wind hauled to W.S.W.
& increased to moderate Gale, with Rainy weather
Latter part the same, Ship Under Reefed Top
sails & Stay sails Lat 34 50 Long 124:26

Friday July 12th 249
Begins with fresh Gale from W.S.W. & Squally
with heavy sea. Ship Under close Reefed Top
sails & Stay sails heading N.W. Middle part,
Wind hauled to South & abated some, Latter part
Moderate Gale from South & Squally weather
Long 123:25

Saturday July 13th 250
Begins with strong winds from South & Rugged
Ship Under Reefed Topsails & Forecourse heading
W.S.W. at dark bore Ship to E.S. & Wind hauling
to Eastward & moderating. Middle part, Wind
died out to Calm. Latter part light breeze from
N.E. with good weather So Ends

Sunday July 14th 251
Begins with fresh breeze from N.E. with good
weather. Ship Under all sail Cruising
at 4 P.M. Spoke Bk Derwent Hunter of
Hobart Town, Nine Months out, with 150 Sp
Middle & Latter parts Moderate Gale from
North with Hazy weather & Rugged
