Brothers of New Bedford Middle & Latter
Wind the same with clear weather

Thursday Nov 7th 367
Begins with strong N.E. winds & heavy
weather Ship under reefed Topsails
Boiling Middle & Latter parts same
Lat 38:23 Long 152:30

Friday Nov 8th 368
Begins with strong breeze from N.E.
with heavy weather Ship under reefed
Topsails Boiling Middle part the wind
increased to moderate Gale from North
with thick weather, Finished Boiling

Saturday Nov 9th 369
Begins with moderate Gale from North
with thick weather Ship under all sail
Storm at heading W.S.W. Middle & Latter
parts strong breeze from North with foggy
weather, Emp, Hauling down Oil No Cox

Sunday Nov 10th 370
Begins with strong winds from North
with thick weather Finished Stowing Oil
& Unshipped the Ship, bore Ship to the West
Middle & Latter parts Wind & weather same
Spoke Bark Mary Hamilton of Melbourne, Vic,
Lat 38:00 S, Long 152:41 East

Monday Nov 11th 371
Begins with strong winds from N.E.
with thick weather Ship under reefed Topsails
Heading N.W. Middle & Latter parts same

Tuesday Nov 12th 372
Begins with sudden change of wind to
South & heavy Squall, shortened sail to close
reefed Main Topsail & stay sails, At dark
blowing heavy from South with Rain, Thunder
& Lightning, Ship Hove too on Eastern Tack
Middle & Latter parts, fresh Gale from S.E. with
squally weather & heavy sea No Cox

Wednesday Nov 13th 373
Begins with fresh Gale from S.E. with squally
weather, Ship Hove too on the Eastern Tack
Middle part Wind moderated to strong breeze
from S.E., Latter part the same, Made sail
standing in toward the Land
Lat 36:41 Long 151:55

Thursday Nov 14th 374
Begins with moderate breeze from S.E.
with good weather, Ship under all sail
steering West, saw the Land at sunset
& hauled off shore Middle & Latter parts, Wind
& weather the same Lat 36:10 Long 151:46

Friday Nov 15th 375
Begins with light air from S.E. with fine
pleasant weather, abt 1 P.M. saw a School
of Sperm Whales to Windward & lowered
four Boats in chase, Struck a Whale to each
Boat & at 10 P.M. had them all to the Ship
At daylight began cutting So Ends

Saturday Nov 16th 376
Begins with fresh breeze from North with
good weather abt 4 P.M. finished cutting
Middle & Latter parts Wind & weather
the same, Employed Boiling
