Sunday Oct 19th

This day strong breeze from East with
rainy weather. Some of the crew on shore
the rest on board

Monday Oct 20th

This day good breeze from South with good
weather. Squared accounts with the fleet
by giving the John Howland nine bbls
of Oil, and the Martha Three, which
gives to each ship, Three Hundred and
seventy nine, barrels

Tuesday Oct 21st

This day fine weather with good breeze from
South sent two boats after coconuts, sent
up Top, Gallant yards & bent the sails and
other work

Wednesday Oct 22nd

This day calm with good weather sent two
boats for coconuts bent fore topsail
and main sail and got the ship ready for
sea David Roberts Green Ward, deserted
from one of the boats, and could not
be found.

Thursday Oct 23rd

This day fine breeze from East with good
pleasant weather, at daylight got
underweigh and ran out of the West
passage, and by 11 A.M. were all clear of
the Land, so ends, with 12 hours Cibel account

Friday Oct 24th Sea set

Begins with fine breeze from East with good
weather steering West in company with
Bk Martha. Hoveed the cables & anchors
cleared up Decks, and made all snug
middle & latter parts strong trade winds
with clear weather ship under all sail steering
S.W. Lat 19.24 Long 175.52 West

Saturday October 25th

Begins with strong Trade winds, with clear
weather ship under all sail, steering S.W.
Bark Martha in company, at dark took
in the light sails, middle & latter parts
wind & weather the same, at daylight
made all sail, course S.W. by South
Lat 21:50 Long 177.43 West

Sunday October 26th

Begins with strong Trade winds, with
clear weather, ship under all sail,
steering S.W. by South, Bark Martha in
company, middle & latter parts wind
the same with rainy weather, No obs

Monday October 27th

This day begins with good breeze from
N.E. with thick rainy weather, ship
under all drawing sail, steering S.W.
middle part part, the wind hauled to
N.E. with some rain, latter part wind
the same and clear weather the Martha
parted company and hauled up for
the Bay of Islands

Lat 24:21 S. Long 179.00 East

Tuesday October 28th

Begins with strong breeze from N.E. with
clear weather ship under all sail course
S.W. middle & latter parts strong wind
from West, Lat 26:30 Long 177:30 East

Wednesday October 29th

Begins with strong westerly winds, and
rugged weather ship under reefed topsails
& courses heading S.W. middle part same
latter part wind moderate from W.S.W.
made all sail, heading South
Lat 27:38 Long 177 16 East
