Begins With Strong Wind from S.E. With clear weather Ship Under all sail Steering W.S.W. At dark luffed to the Wind, and shortened sail. Middle & Latter parts Wind & Weather same

Friday Nov 21<sup>st</sup> 7.44

Begins With Morning breeze from South With fine weather Ship Under all sail heading W.S.W. At dark shortened sail Middle part Wind hauled to North. Latter part same Lat 36 08 Long 156:45

Saturday Nov 22<sup>nd</sup> 7.45

Begins With good breeze from North With cloudy weather Ship Under all sail Cruising Spoke 5th Emel Downing of Hobart Town, Middle & Latter parts Wind & Weather same

Sunday Nov 23<sup>th</sup> 7.46

Begins With strong Wind from S.E. With clear weather Ship Under Reefed Topsails & Courses Middle part Wind increasing Latter part Moderate Gale from S.E. With squally weather Saw Spum Whales Lowered three boats soon after struck one to the Harbored Boat, after being fast a while drew from him. It being too rugged to chase called the Boats on board, Wind increasing put the Ship under close Reefed Main Topsail & Starsail So Ends  
Lat 37:20 Long 156:30

Monday Nov 24<sup>th</sup> 7.47

Begins With Gale from S.E. With heavy Sea and clear weather Spum Whales in sight going to seaward and Ship following them At dark the Wounded Whale in sight Nearly dead. Middle and Latter parts fresh Gale and thick weather Ship Hove to on the N.E. tack

Begins With fresh Gale from S.E. With heavy Sea Ship Hove to Under Storm sail Middle part same Latter part Wind moderating Made some sail and Wore Ship to S.W. Lat 35:50 Long 155:50

Wednesday Nov 26<sup>th</sup> 7.49

Begins With strong Winds from S.E. With Rugged weather Ship Under Reefed Topsails & Fore Course Cruising Middle & Latter parts Wind Moderate from same quarter With squall weather and heavy swell

Thursday Nov 27<sup>th</sup> 7.50

Begins With Moderate Wind from South With Rain squalls Ship Under all sail Cruising Middle and Latter parts baffling Winds from S.E. Ship on different Tacks  
Lat 37:07 Long 156:39

Friday Nov 28<sup>th</sup> 7.51

Begins With strong Wind from South With fair weather Ship Under Topsails & Courses Cruising. Middle part Wind light and hauling to Westward. Latter part part light breeze from W.N.W. With cloudy weather Steering S.W.  
Lat 37:11 Long 156:54

Saturday Nov 29<sup>th</sup> 7.52

Begins With light breeze from W.N.W. With cloudy weather Ship Under all sail Steering S.W. At dark shortened sail. Weather Raining. Middle and Latter parts strong Winds from N.N.W. With thick Rainy weather

Sunday Nov 30<sup>th</sup> 7.53

Begins With weather clearing and Wind hauling. At sunset Moderate Gale from S.E. put the Ship Under Storm sail heading E.N.E. Middle and Latter parts Wind and weather the same At daylight Wore Ship to S.S.W. and Made some sail Lat 37:07 Long 156:07
