XX Thursday March 5th 845
Begins with strong winds from East. With thick hazy weather and very rugged. Ship under reefed Topsails and Courses heading N.N.E. at 4 P.M. Saw Sperm Whales. Lowered three boats. but did not see the Whales again either from boats or ship. Middle part wind hauled to N.E. Latter part same with thick weather

Friday March 6th 845
Begins with strong wind from N.E. with thick hazy weather. Ship under Topsails & Courses. Cruising Middle part wind died to calm with hazy weather. Latter part same

Saturday March 7th 846
Begins calm with heavy rain at sun set light breeze from S.W. weather clearing. Middle part wind increased to moderate Gale. Latter part the same with squally weather

Sunday March 8th 847
Begins with moderate Gale from S.W. with squally weather. Ship under reefed Topsails and Fore Course. Steering East at dark shortened sail and hove too on the Western Tack. Middle & Latter parts wind and weather the same

Monday March 9th 848
Begins with moderate Gale from S.W. with squally weather. Ship under short sail on the Western Tack. Middle & Latter parts. Strong winds from E.S.E. & rugged weather. At daylight bore ship to the N.E. and set the Fore Course

Tuesday March 10th 849
This day begins with strong E.S.E. winds and squally weather. Ship on the N.E. tack under reefed Topsails & Foresail. Middle part wind the same. Latter part wind hauled to South
Lat 34:00 Long 158:13

Wednesday March 11th 850
Begins with strong winds from South with squally rugged weather. Ship under reefed Topsails & Courses, Steering East. Middle & Latter parts wind & weather same
Lat 33:50 Long 159:58

Thursday March 12th 851
Begins with strong winds from S.E. with squally weather. Ship under reefed Topsails and Courses heading E by North. Middle and Latter parts wind more moderate from same quarter. At daylight tacked to the S.W. and made all sail
Lat 33:37 Long 160:48

Friday March 13th 852
Begins with moderate wind from S.E. with good weather. Ship under all sail heading S.S.W. at 4 P.M. tacked to E.N.E. Middle part wind increased to moderate Gale from South. Latter part same with squally weather
Lat 33:07 Long 160:00

Saturday March 14th 853
Begins with moderate Gale from South with squally weather. Ship under reefed Topsails and Courses. Steering N.N.E. at dark wind the same. Shortened sail and hauled up to East. Middle & Latter parts wind more moderate from S.W. with weather thick and hazy
