Thursday July 2nd

This day begins with Moderate winds from S.W. 962
With strong squally weather Ship under short sail
Cruising Middle part same latter part good breeze
from E.S.E. & squally. Lat 26:19 Long 175:57

Friday July 3rd

Begins with fresh breeze from E.S.E. with fair weather 968
Ship under all sail heading N.E. at dark shortened
sail. Middle & latter parts strong winds from
S.E. with rugged weather
Lat 25:36 Long 175:17

Saturday July 4th

Begins with strong S.E. winds & rugged weather 964
Ship under short sail cruising Middle part same
latter part good breeze from S.W. with fair weather
steering N.E. sent down Fore topsail for repairs
Lat 25:00 Long 174:33

Sunday July 5th

Begins with strong breeze from S.W. with squally 965
weather steering N.E. at dark shortened sail
and luffed to the wind on the Eastern tack
Middle & latter parts Moderate Gale from S.W.
with squally weather Steered off N.E. under Reefed
Main topsail

Monday July 6th

Begins with Moderate Gale from S.W. with squally 966
weather steering from N.E. to North under short sail
Middle part Wind Moderated to good breeze
latter part same with good weather Made
all the sail that would draw steering N by W

Lat 22:45 Long 173 03

Repaired the Fore Course and bent it again

Tuesday July 7th

Begins with good breeze from South. with good 967
weather Ship under all drawing sail steering
N by W. Middle & latter parts Wind & weather same
Lat 20:29 Long 173:13 West

Wednesday July 8th

Begins with Moderate breeze from S.E. with good 968
weather Ship under all sail steering N.W. at dark
shortened sail. At 10 P.M. hauled aback and lay
until daylight latter part strong breeze from S.E. and
squally weather at daylight saw the Island of Apia
kept off steering N.W. at 11 A.M. took a Native Pilot
and ran down to an anchorage, about two miles from
the Land. Came to in Eighteen Fathoms of Water
with Coral Bottom. With Best Bower and Seventy
fathoms of Chain at afternoon, took in the Larboard
Boat, to Repair

Thursday July 9th

This day light breeze from S.E. with showery 969
weather. sent down Top gallants sails & Gards
Finished Repairing Larboard Boat and put her
on the Cranes and done other work.

Friday July 10th

This day light breeze from S.E. with good weather 970
Painted the Larboard Boat and began repairs
on another at afternoon Bark Alaska of New
Bedford came to Anchor about one mile to the
Northward of us.

Saturday July 11th

This day light airs & good weather This morning 971
sent two Boats off to Trade for Yams and other Recruits
At dark, returned to the Ship. without much success

Sunday July 12th

This day Calm all day, Nothing doing 972
