Friday 30th

To day fine clear weather. The crew Employed Employed
in strong water provisions and wood settings up
Shooks.

Received twenty Cuses of Beef two do of Molasses
Manuel Tain and Manuel Freyre departed the Ship
So ends this day.

Saturday May 1st 1875

This day fine weather
all hands Employed as yesterday getting the
Ship Ready for sea So ends the day.

Sunday 2nd

To day Clear weather at times with frequent showers
of Rain So ends this day.

Monday 3rd

This day Clear weather at times The men Employed
in getting the Ship Ready for sea strong wood and
water and other duty Ends this day.

Tuesday 4th

Dark heavy weather all through the day
The men Employed in breaking out oil and other duty.

Wednesday 5th

This day begins with Rain and strong breeze from the
Westward.

Employed in strong the wood and other duty.

Received Sea Sugar Tobacco and other small stores
at half past 3 pm Stopped work on a Court of Rains.

at Hobart Town May 6th 1875

Thursday 6th

This day begins with a fine Rain no work going on on account of
Rain. Received on Board bottles Rice Coffee and Molasses
two depistors restand on Board and went to duty. So ends,

Friday 7th

To day begins with a fine breeze and clear weather
Ship Ready to haul out in the stream.

Received two Cuses of potatoes and other small stores
So ends this day.

Saturday 8th

First part of this day Clear weather and a moderate breeze
 Latter part fine Rain.

at 9 a.m. Hauld out in the stream and anchored with
60 fathoms of Chain. furled the Sails and other duty
So ends this day.

Sunday 9th

First part of this day Commenced with fine Rain
 Latter part no Rain but Cloudy and Clear,
all the old hands on board.

Barometer low down. So ends this day.

Monday 10th

This day Moderate breeze from the S.E. with Clear weather
Cold wind the sun sent the main sail and dried the
other sails put the Craft in the Boats and other duty
five new hands. Come on board.

Mr Hall the 1st Mate Come on Board and went to his duty
So ends this day.

Tuesday 11th

To day light breeze at times with dark heavy weather
Ship in the stream ready for sea.

The men Employed in picking up and strong things a
way and other duty.

The Cook and one man Come on board to duty.

Received 26.00 weight of potatoes.

The 2nd Mr Rhodhouse went on shore before the Council and got
lay milled from the 30th to the 24th. Mr Lupton from the 65th lay
to the 45th lay.
