Friday June 4<sup>th</sup>

This Day begins and ends with a fair breeze from E. & E ship under all sail on the main on different tacks at dark took in sail ship on the port tack steering S. E. by S so ends the Day

Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup>

This Day began with a fair breeze from E. & E ship under all sail steering by the main on the starboard tack under all sail at one S. & raised spin. Whale loosed three boats but did not get past so ends the Day in

Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> (Listed as 4<sup>th</sup> Jan 1855-56)

This Day began with squally weather wind all round the compass ship under all sail trying to go S. E. so ends the Day

Monday June 7<sup>th</sup>

This Day began with the wind from E. & E. with rain squalls. Wind part wind round to S. E. raining heavy. later part wind from N. E. fair weather ship under double reefed topsails and courses on the port tack

Tuesday June 8<sup>th</sup>

This Day fore part wind from from E. & E ship under all sail on the main on the port tack. Wind later part wind from N. E. ship on the port tack the Bark Matilda. Sails in sight so ends the Day

Crews in the Vicinity of Catons Bank

Wednesday June 9<sup>th</sup>

This Day began with a strong breeze from N. W. ship under double reefed topsails and courses on the main on the S. tack later part wind from W. S. W. gale with the Matilda sails so ends the Day

Thursday June 10<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours began and ends with light fine weather. Wind from S. W. ship on different tacks and sail in sight the watch employed at oil pokes the mason employed fixing the byworks

Friday June 11<sup>th</sup>

This Day began and ends with light fine weather. Wind from W. S. W. ship under all sail on the S. S. at twelve M kept of S. E. the watch employed painting the quarter boats and scraping the plank shears ready for painting so ends the Day

Saturday June 12<sup>th</sup>

This Day began & ends with light fine weather. Wind from the Northward and Westward ship under all sail steering E. S. E. two sails in sight at sundown took in sail so ends the Day

Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours fine weather. All the ship under all sail by the main on the port tack two sails in sight at dark took in the light sails
