Friday June 25th
This Day began with a fresh breeze from E. N. E. ship under reefed topsails and courses crew in Middle and later parts the same gave with the Matilda bears so ends the Day

Saturday June 26th
This Day begins and ends with a strong breeze from N. E. ship by the wind on the S. S. under double reefed topsails and courses Middle and later parts the same the watch employed at all gales

Sunday June 27th
This twenty four hours a fresh gale all through the ship under reefed topsails and fore sail by the wind on the S. S. heading N. W. at Dark close reefed the Main topsail

Monday June 28th
This twenty four hours began with a gale from S. E. ship by the wind on the S. S. Middle part blowing heavy with a heavy rain, later part rain ceased to S. W. ship under storm sails so ends the Day

Tuesday June 29th
This Day began and ends with a strong breeze from S. W. ship under all sail part of the time later part double reefed topsails ship on different tack

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Wednesday June 30th
This Day fine weather all through with a heavy swell ship under all sail steering different courses the Watch employed sitting up the fore rigging so ends the Day

Thursday July 1st
This Day began with light fine weather wind from S. E. Middle part strong breeze later part the same with equally weather and Brig and our Bark in sight

Friday July 2nd
This Day began with a fresh breeze from N. E. ship under reefed topsails and courses Middle part calm Baffin air with a heavy fall of rain later part fresh gale from N. W. ship and the starboard tack under close reefed Main topsail so ends the Day

Saturday July 3rd
This Day began and ends with a strong breeze from S. W. ship under reefed topsails and courses steering S. E. so ends the Day

Sunday July 4th
This Day began with light equally weather ship under all sail steering S. E. Middle and later parts the same so ends the Day

Monday July 5th
This Day began and ends with a strong breeze from S. W. ship under all sail steering E. S. E. so ends the Day
