Lat 22° 59' Lon 178° 55'

Tuesday Oct 27th

This Day began with a strong breeze from N. Middle part wind N.W. with heavy rain later part wind S.W. with fine weather

Lat 24° 27' Lon 178° 13'

Wednesday Oct 28th

This Day fine breeze from E.S.E. ship under full sail steering S.W. painter S.E. & S.S. but a new Main topsail

Thursday Oct 29th

This Day fine weather wind from E.S.E. ship under full sail steering S.W. by S.

Friday Oct 30th

This Day fine weather ship under full sail steering S.W. by W. the watch Bury mending sails

Saturday Oct 31st

This Day began with a strong breeze from N ship under full sail steering S.W. by W. at five P.M. as we shifted to S.W. with heavy rain ship under double reefed topsails on the S.S. tack

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Sunday Oct 31st

This Day began our sail with a fresh gail from S.W. later part heavy squalls in our blank the fore stactel away

Monday Nov 1st

This Day fine weather ship under topsails and courses by the wind bearing from S. to W.S.W.

Tuesday Nov 2nd

This Day began with a fresh gail from N.W. ship under full sail reefed Main topsail later part weather clear wind from W.S.W. ship on the S.S. tack in

Wednesday Nov 3rd

This Day began our sail with a strong breeze from N.W. ship on different tacks

Thursday Nov 4th

This Day began with a fresh gail from N.W. ship under full sail reefed topsails by the wind on the S.S.

Friday Nov 5th

Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. ship under topsails and courses by the wind on the S.S. later part wind S. ship under full sail steering W. by W.
