B. struck and got a fifty Bbl whale at Dark got him to long ship got supper and set the watch Middle part the watch employed getting ready to cut later part all hands employed cutting in so ends

Thursday Mar the 9th

This Day begins with a strong breeze from E. All hands employed cutting at Dark all through quick cut all ticks washed down set close reefed topsails and wore ship heading N. N. E. started the try works so ends the fore part Middle and later part the same so ends the Day

Friday Mar the 10th

This Day begins with a strong breeze from E. N. E. ship under close reefed topsails Boiling gale with the Matilda sails so ends the fore part Middle part weather the same later fine weather the same watch employed Boiling so ends the Day

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Saturday Mar the 11th

This Day begins with a strong breeze from E ship under double reefed topsails on different tack so ends the fore part Middle part the same later part a fresh gail from E. N. E. three sails in sight so ends the Day

Sunday Mar the 12th

This Day begins with a fresh gail from E. N. E. ship under reefed topsails on the S. S. two sails in sight at Dark two close reefed topsails so ends the fore part Middle part the same later part ship under double reefed topsails and fore sail

Monday Mar the 13th

This Day begins with a fresh gail from E ship under double reefed topsails at Dark close reefed so ends the fore part Middle part the same later part ship under double reefed topsails so ends the Day

Tuesday Mar the 14th

This Day began with a strong breeze from E ship under double reefed topsails gale with the figure sixteen months out four ten hundred bbls so ends the fore part of the Day Middle and later parts weather the same ship under the same sail

Wednesday Mar the 15th

This Day begins with a fresh gail from E ship on the S. S. ack under double reefed topsails and fore sail are sail in sight all hands employed running down sail ran the tank full and stowed four cask between Decks so ends the fore part Middle and later parts the same so ends the Day
