

Bark Mary Thagier at Anchor at Bay of Islands April, 24 1876

Monday 24th

This begins with Rain not much work going on
put the Masts on liberty
loose the Sails and furl them gain on
account of Rain so ends this day.

Tuesday 25th

at day light dark Cloudy looking Weather
at 8 a.m. loosed the Sails to dry.
Commenced Shaking Castles and clearing
them away. Bark gazelle went to sea.
at sunset furl the Sails so ends the day

Wednesday 26th

This day begins with Clear weather at times
with the Wind from the S.W.
with light Squall of Rain.
got through with the Shooks and Stood
them away. dried the Main Sail and
sent it over again.
Bark Betula Lewis went to sea to day
so ends this day.

Thursday 27th

at day light Clear weather til 9 p.m. let in
to Rain and blow heard from the S.W.
Men employed in Ships duty.
Received three Boards of Wood and Stood at every
washed off the decks so ends this day.

Friday 28th

This day begins with Moderate breeze from
the S.W. with Clear weather.
Ship ready for sea.
down some work in the rigging
so ends this day.

Saturday 29th

This day begins with a light breeze from the S.W.
with Clear weather.
Bent new gill and fixing jubb.
at 8 a.m. got to beads and 2 1/2 Gons of potatoes
one Gon and a half of Beans. one Bag of
Beers and one of Hairly. Four small
kegs of Butter.
Stood the Provisions and cleared up the decks
and other duty. so ends this day.

Sunday 30th

This day begins a brief calm day the Clear and Seaside
at 3 p.m. wind hauled to the N.W. Sky Cloudy,
a part of the crew on liberty.
so ends this day.

Monday 1st May 1876.

to day Clear weather at daylight hauled the Ship
out in the Stream.
got off a small raft of water, and received
a few small stores.
pointed the gunway and other duty so ends.

Tuesday 2nd

at daylight Clear weather Calm at times
at noon it in to Rain. at 1 p.m. weather more
Clear Wind more to the Southward.
at 5 p.m. Brought the Anchor and went to sea
with a light Easterly wind.
anchors in Show. J.
at 8 p.m. past the whaling Bark Counsel of
New Bedford bound in to the Bay.
18 all told in the Forecastle. J.
at Sun set wind light and chafing.
Cape Brit Bare N.E. distance 18 miles
at 9 p.m. Calm. so ends this day.
