

Barth. Mary Thayer. Home Board, May 3rd 1896

Wednesday 3rd

This day begins with a light breeze from the westward steering from N. to East at daylight commenced to stow the anchors. got through at 9 am, and Col. Parrel the anchors. Middle part, light winds from off shore. steering N.W. to S. E. ends.

Thursday 4th

These 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the westward steering S.W. with all possible sail set. The Watch Employed in Ships duty. Middle part light winds all through the night. Latter part wind moderate from the westward so ends this day. Lat. 34° 23' South, Long 174° 53' W

Friday 5th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S.E. with frequent squalls of Rain Ship heading S.W. Middle part strong from the S.W. steering S.W. Latter part blowing strong from South. steering East at 4 p.m. double reefed the top sails and made all sail snug so ends this day. Lat. 35° 23' South, Long 174° 23' East

Saturday 6th

Strong breeze from South and S.E. with heavy sea steering S.W. at times middle part do, Latter part wind more to the Eastward ship heading to the S.W. by the wind with all possible sail set so ends this day. Lat. 35° 45' South, Long 174° 40' West.

Bound to the Western ground to Cruise Sunday 7th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind with all possible sail set. in west longitude.

Middle part do.

Latter part blowing strong from the S.E. at 5 p.m. double reefed the top sails. Lat. 35° 49' South

Sunday 7th

First part begins with a moderate breeze from the S.E. ship by the wind on the Starboard Yacht with all possible sail set. Latter part more at times with some Rain. Middle part equally with frequent showers of Rain Ship heading from N.E. to S.W. all through these 24 hours so ends this day. Lat. 35° 42' South,

Monday 8th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S.E. ship by the wind on Starboard Yacht heading S.W. Middle part moderate from the Southward heading East. Latter part ship on the port Yacht heading S.W. Yacht the in the anchors on deck, and Bow and west Boats and other duty so ends. Lat. 35° 26' South.

Tuesday 9th

Strong breeze from the S.E. with heavy sea and frequent squalls of Rain. Ship on distant Yachts. Middle part equally at times heading to the Southward on Starboard Yacht with all possible sail set. Latter part more ship to the Eastward double reefed the top sails. so ends this day. Lat. 35° 40' South, Long 171° 00' West.
