

Bark Mary Hazies of New Bedford June 15th 1876

Thursday June 15th

First part Moderate breeze from the Westward with some rain steering to the N.E. with all possible sail set

Middle part Clear weather with a light breeze from the W.N.W. steering N.E.

Latter part pleasant weather with wind from the front the W.N.W. Course E.N.E.

at 5 p.m. Creped up Strong doubled the top sails and took in other sail. So Ends this day

Lat. 55° 46' South
Long 63° 38' West

Friday June 16th

These 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. and N.E. by N. under double reefed top sails.

Middle part the same.

Latter part Strong breeze from the N.E. with heavy sea running. Saw some kelp or sea weed.

John Compey off duty with a clear hand.

Fisco off duty with a clear hand.

Frank off duty with a clear hand.

John Brayno off duty with a clear hand.

Cape Cod fever seems to be quite a prevailing disease up in these latitudes.

Lat. 54° 13' South
Long 55° 11' West

Saturday June 17th

to day commenced with a strong breeze from the N.E. with frequent squalls steering N.E. by N. under double reefed top sails.

Middle part Ghost reefed the fore top sail and furled the fore sail. Course do.

Latter part more moderate Wind from W.N.W.

steering N.E. with all possible sail set.

The watch employed in Bending the Fore sail over a gain and other duty.

Frank the Boat Stew on duty. So Ends these 24 hours.

Sunday 18th

light Winds from the westward steering N.E. with all possible sail set.

Middle part Calm.

Latter part the same till 2 p.m. got a light breeze from the S.E. ship heading to the Northward by the wind So Ends this day. No observations

Monday 19th

First part of these 24 Hours begins with a light breeze from the S.E. steering N.E. with all possible sail set.

Middle and latter parts the same.

The Watch employed in Ships duty shifting the Darks and good stanchings in the place of the Breacking ones. Saw nothing of any note so Ends.

Tuesday June 20th

To day light Winds all through these 24 Hours Course N.E. with all possible sail set with the wind from S.E. to S.W.

The Watch employed in Ships duty fletting Davis and stanchings so we can get the boats out for Whaling So Ends this day.

Lat. 50° 03' South
Long 51° 30' West

Wednesday June 21st

First part light breeze from the S.E.

Middle part Strong from the S.E. and lifting steering N.E. with all possible sail set.

Latter Strong and squally at 4 p.m. wind more from the Eastward. Ship by the wind heading N.E. at Sun set the weather looking dark and squally. all possible sail set.

Saw much sea weed and other drift stuff so Ends this day.
