Latter part Winds baffling from all points of the Compass. Ship on divergent Tacks working to the N.E. with all Sail Set. one Sail in Sight working to the N.E. do Ends this day.

First part Strong Breeze from the N.E. Ship by the wind on port Tack all Sail Set do Ends the first part. Middle part Ship on divergent Tacks.

Latter part Strong Breeze furler some of the light Sails Ship by the wind heading East all through the day. at daylight jibb. Key started. Repaired it and set the jibb.

one Sail in Company with us do Ends this day. Lat. 31.54. South. Long 31.58. West.

Tuesday July 4th 1876

all through these 24 hours Strong Breeze from the N.W. with frequent squalls of Rain Ship under short Sail heading to the N.E. do Ends these 24 hours. Lat. 31.28. South.

Wednesday June 5th

First part Strong Breeze from the Westward Steering N.W. under double Reefed Topsails.

Middle part Strong Breeze with frequent squalls of Rain Steering North.

Latter part squally with a Strong Breeze Course the same.

Thursday 6th

First part of this day begins with a Strong Breeze from the N.W. with frequent squalls of Rain. Middle and latter parts the same.
