Monday November 1 - 1858

strong Trades on the starboard tack heading
E.S.E. doing odd jobs in the rigging

on the larboard tack heading W.S.W.
saw white water mended the job
at night tacked ship

Wednesday November 4 - 1858

on the larboard tack heading W. by S.
mending the mainsail: saw cowfish & Porpoises
at night tacked ship to the Eastward

Thursday November 4 - 1858

mainsail and mended the main top sail: started one
barrel of water: saw finbacks and Porpoises: at night saw
Indefatigable Island: at night saw the comet

hoisted out and repaired the larboard pump
at night saw Chatham Island to the S. S.E.

Saturday November 6 - 1858

on the starboard tack heading E by S. Chatham
Island in sight on the weather beam saw Porpoises
