

Statter Shore

Saturday June 18 - 1859 -
at daylight ~~Port~~ ^{Port} head 6 miles off
seven o'clock in the forenoon dropped anchor
in Port harbor in the afternoon took
30 lbs meat from the Spanish Basildemar
and took ashore 15 lbs oil

Sunday June 19 - 1859
one the o'clock in the afternoon weighed anchor
went to sea at night off Cape Blanco

Monday June 20 - 1859.
foggy and fine rain. Steering west N. west
renewed the anchor and stowed away the cable.
Saw Blackfish

Tuesday June 21 1859
Steering N by W. renewed the top sail skunkies
and at hantines - saw Blackfish

Wednesday June 22 - 1859
steering N. by W. saw finbacks and
- a Seapuss

Cyprus

Thursday June 23 - 1859
Steering to the westward saw finbacks
and one sail steering to the eastward

Friday June 24 - 1859
on the larboard tack steering by the wind
came up with and fitted main de fore stay
saw finbacks and Porpoises

Saturday June 25 - 1859
on the larboard tack heading S.W. by South
saw finbacks and Porpoises

Sunday June 26 - 1859
on the larboard tack heading S.W. saw finbacks
and Blackfish at night shortened sail

Monday June 27 - 1859 at daylight saw Woods
Setting up the fore to Larboard Shrouds and back stays
Three o'clock in the afternoon raised Charles Island
and three sails
