 Remarks Saturday January 12<sup>th</sup> 1861  
 Fore part strong breeze from the South heading  
 ESE, to SE by E fitted & bent a fore stay sail  
 Middle part moderating at 10 P M wore ship  
 to Westward at daylight made all sail latter  
 part fresh breeze at 7 P M latched ship to the  
 ESE, strong breeze copied our last fare & stowed  
 it between decks 3 casks 12 bbls Lat by Obs 32° 38' S  
 Long by Chron 47° 20' W

Remarks Sunday Jan 13<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part fresh breeze from the Southward heading  
 ESE at 7 P M latched heading W by S with cloudy  
 weather Middle part continuing much the same  
 latter part fine saw some beaches on the weather  
 beam called them Annapolis Lat by Obs 33° 33' S  
 Long by Chron 47° 29' W

Remarks Monday Jan 14<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part moderate breeze & fine weather at 10 A  
 latched ship to the SE at 6 P M the wind heading  
 to the SE square in the yards steering E by S  
 Middle part the wind heading gradually to the  
 NE latter part moderate breeze & fine weather  
 Lat by Obs 34° 43' S  
 Long by Chron 47° 33' W

Remarks Tuesday Jan 15<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part fine breeze from NNE & good weather  
 saw several small beaches Annapolis on gunpowder  
 steering E by S saw two Burgis standing to the Eastward  
 at 7 P M took in sail & hysed to the wind heading  
 NE Middle & latter parts continue fine  
 Lat by Obs 34° 16' S  
 Long by Chron 48° 35' W

on a Whaling voyage to the Pacific Ocean  
 Remarks Wednesday Jan 16<sup>th</sup> 1861  
 Fore part light breeze from NE steering to fine weather  
 saw two sails to windward break out for water & filled  
 the casks with salt water Middle part much the  
 same latter part strong breeze one sail in sight  
 Lat by Obs 34° 47' S  
 Long by Chron 48° 39' W

Remarks Thursday Jan 17<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part strong breeze from the SE heading  
 to the S & W at 7 P M took in sail & wore ship  
 middle & latter parts continue  
 much the same two sails in sight  
 Lat by Obs 34° 10' S  
 Long by Chron 48° 44' W

Remarks Friday Jan 18<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part strong breeze from the S & E  
 heading to the S & W at 4 P M spoke  
 the Emma Coping sized Bedford Capt  
 Howse bound clean hull a gann  
 Middle & latter parts the weather moderating  
 Lat by Obs 34° 46' S  
 Long by Chron 50° 38' W

Remarks Saturday Jan 19<sup>th</sup>  
 Fore part a moderate breeze from the NE steering  
 SE at 6 P M Capt Howse came on board & exchan-  
 ged a Coie of Manila Rope with us we let him  
 have a Keg of Oil to burn at dark took in sail  
 heading to the SE Eastward Middle part laying with  
 the Main yard aback at 12 M wore ship to the NE  
 latter part fine breeze at daylight made all sail  
 steering N by E the Emma in sight Lat by Obs 35° 13' S  
 Long by Chron 51° 25' W
