 Fore part a strong breeze from the NW & very
 rugged lots of Whales in sight at 11 P.M. got under
 to Chumaw covered the 2nd Boat at 3 P.M. the
 2nd Boat struck a large whale the Capt went on to
 the whale twice a good chance & the Boat struck
 missed him finally the whale took to running
 to windward could not get up to him again
 finally bound & took both times the Boat
 got aboard about sundown & hoisted up a number
 of Whales in sight going to leeward got supper
 took in sail & set the watch heading S by E
 Middle & Latter parts fresh breeze the wind hauling
 round to the Southward Lat by Obs 37° 14' S
 Long by Chron 52° 09' W

Remarks Tuesday Jan 29th
 Fore part a fresh breeze from the SE Eastward heading
 to the SE Eastward saw some Composita at sundown
 took in sail heading NE, NE, at 8 P.M. steering
 NW at 2 P.M. luffed too heading NE Latter
 part fine weather Lat by Obs 35° 47' S
 Long by Chron 51° 38' W

Remarks Wednesday Jan 30th
 Fore part light breeze from the NW steering to
 the Southward saw nothing in sight making
 Boat sail & at sundown took in sail heading
 S by E, with cloudy weather Middle & Latter parts
 fine weather Lat by Obs 36° 15' S
 Long by Chron

Remarks Thursday Jan 31st
 Fore part light breeze from the NE with fine
 weather at sundown took in sail Middle &
 Latter parts much the same Lat by Obs 46° 14' S
 Long by Chron

 Remarks Friday Feb 1st 1861
 Fore part fresh breeze from the SE steering by the
 wind at 4 P.M. spoke the Thomas & Co. several
 sails in sight had a game & season out 3000
 lbs Middle & Latter parts fresh breeze from NW
 a number of Ships in sight Lat by Obs 36° 31' S
 Long by Chron 52° 32' W

Remarks Saturday Feb 2nd
 Fore part a fresh breeze from the Southward steering
 by E & or Six Ships in sight standing to the
 Eastward employed making Boat sail &
 Middle & Latter parts foggy at 11 P.M. the fog
 cleared off the water very green Lat by Obs 37° 12' S
 Long by Chron 53° 12' W

Remarks Sunday Feb 3rd
 Fore part light wind from the SE Eastward heading
 to the Eastward saw some Composita & one large Ship
 standing to the NE at sundown took in sail
 Middle & Latter parts moderate Lat by Obs 37° 39' S
 Long by Chron 52° 02' W

Remarks Monday Feb 4th
 Fore part moderate breeze from the SE heading
 to the E NE with fine weather saw some Composita
 open at sunset took in sail Middle & Latter
 parts much the same Lat by Obs 36° 23' S
 Long by Chron 52° 53' W

Remarks Tuesday Feb 5th
 Fore part strong breeze from the SE NE steering
 to the Westward at 3 P.M. saw a Sail at 5 P.M.
 spoke her the Virago Capt Green of Edge Town
 39 ans out 3000 lbs bound home Middle
 part much the same Latter part a Gale from the
 NE Lat by Obs 37° 23' S
 Long by Chron 53° 20' W
