

Back Malitia Seas of Dartmouth Capt Howland
Remarks Thursa July 11th 1861

Fore part light air & calms variously employed
at 8-5 A took a light air from ESE heading to the
S, at dark shortened sail saw a few B Backs Middle
& latter parts had more wind at 8 A M kept her
off E & W had some rain squalls No Obs

Remarks Frida July 12th

Fore part a fine breeze from NE steering S, S W, employ
setting up the head rigging Jib Guiz Top mast & Top sails
Backstays &c at dark took in sail & luffed to the wind
heading S, E by E, one sail in sight to leeward
Middle part the wind light latter part squally with rain

Lat by Obs 20° 12' 34" S

Long by Chron 92° 01' W

Remarks Saturda July 13th

Fore fresh breeze from the NE with rain squalls
heading N, N W saw plenty of Sulphur Bottomed
two ships in sight at dark shortened sail
Middle & latter parts fresh breeze with rain squalls
No Obs

Remarks Suna July 14th

Fore part strong breeze from the NE heading to the
N, N W at 4 P M spoke the President of New Bedford
Capt May 21 and out 450 lbs 230 lbs mason
Middle & latter parts strong breeze with rain squalls
at 6 P M kept her off E W two hills in sight No Obs

Remarks Mond July 15th

Fore part strong breeze & rain squalls from the NE
steering E W at dark took in sail & luffed to the wind
heading N, W by N rather moderating the President
in sight to windward Middle & latter parts moderate
at 7 A M kept her off to the westward set down the
S Top sail for repairs cloudy weather No Obs

crossing on the Archer Ground

Remarks Tuesa July 16th 1861

Fore part light wind from the NE steering to the NE
furnished the Top sail & bent it at 5 P M had a game
with the President exchanged some shoes & Bon flops
gave her some heavy ones for lighter middle part
the wind very light the latter part calms with rain
squalls

Long by Chron 93° 58' W, Lat by Obs 19° 26' S

Remarks Wednesa July 17th

Fore part light air from the E heading S, S E, employed
at ships duty the Carpenter repairing a boat at dark
shortened sail & wore ship to the S, S E, Middle & latter
parts much the same employed breaking out for water
took out the remains of our bread & flour & drove
it passed a Whales Carcass

Lat by Obs 19° 13' S

Long by Chron 93° 54' W

Remarks Thursa July 18th

Fore part a fine breeze from E, S E, heading NE furnished
cooping the bread & flour & stove off again at dark
took in the Light sails & wore ship heading S fine
weather Middle & latter parts much the same
Lat by Obs 19° 42' S

Remarks Frida July 19th

Fore part fine breeze at E, S E, heading E variously
employed saw plenty of B Backs at dark shortened
sail & wore ship to the NE Middle & latter parts
squally with rain one sail in sight No Obs

Remarks Saturda July 20th

Fore part the wind from E, S E, heading to the NE
with frequent rain squalls employed washing ship &c
two ships in sight to windward Middle & latter parts
much the same at 11 A M wore ship Lat by Obs 19° 7' S
