Remarks Tuna April 14th 1862
Fore part foggy middle part foggy latter part fine

Remarks Monda April 15th
Fore part foggy discharged Bill Jones sick with
a fever one of the mice that runaway brought
off the other two Riley & Wilson put them in
trous & put them in the Blueber room got
two pieces twilled Cotton for Boat Sails from
the Lancer Capt Allen latter part calm

Remarks Tuna April 15th
Fore part calm a Boy came off Shippea a
Storage Boy & Mandley went forward who
has acted as such since we left home
middle part continues calm at 12 N took
our Anchor & stood to Sea light breeze from
the S Eastward

Remarks Wednesday April 16th
Fore part light breeze from the Southward
standing down the Bay employees stowing
the Anchor & Cables cleared up decks &
washed off chow watches & Boats crew we
have now 19 men before the mast at dusk
the Ship heading W by N at 9 P M the
wind hauling SE & blowing on double reef
the Top Sails standing W latter part the same
Lat by Obs 33° 41' S

Remarks Thursday April 17th
Fore part strong breeze with cloudy weather
from SE standing W by N saw a Bark coming
spoke her the Sapho Capt Coffin took out
from Calashuano sun from N wales two
got 1 large one one ship heading SE at 7 P M
two sails in sight latter part standing N W, N 30° E

Steering to the Westward
Remarks Friday April 18th 1862
Fore part strong breeze with cloudy weather
standing N W at 1 P M huffed to the wind
heading heading E by N the wind from
the SE the Sapho in sight middle part
moderating latter part light breeze & fine
weather standing N the kind of employees repairing
the Main top Sail
Long by Chron 76° 35' W, Lat by Obs 33° 00' S

Remarks Saturday April 19th
Fore part light breeze & fine weather from
the S standing W furnished the Main top Sail
& sent it the Sapho in sight on the weather
bow middle part the same at 12 N tacked
Ship to the Eastward latter part fresh breeze
Lat by Obs 34° 34' S

Remarks Tuna April 20th
Fore part strong breeze from E, E E, tacked Ship
to the S at dusk took in sail middle
& latter part about calm at daylight the
Island of Guanfuanadiz in sight one sail
Lat by Obs 34° 32' S

Remarks Monda April 21st
Fore part calm at 3 P M took a light air from the
Northward at 6 P M tacked Ship to the N, N E,
the Land 4 points on the weather Bow
middle part breezing on latter part strong
breeze heading to the N one sail in sight
Long by Chron 79° 18' W, Lat by Obs 34° 08' S

Remarks Tuna April 22nd
Fore part strong breeze from N heading N
at 4 P M spoke the Merlin Capt J. Lewis
Boiling 22 mo out 1150 lbs of gunpowder at 9 P M
heading N E by N middle & latter part
strong Gale from N W heading N E by N
Lat by Obs 34° 09' S
