

Banks Matthea Seas of Dartmouth Capt. Howland
Remarks Mon April 13th 1863

Fore part took a light breeze from the Southward steering ESE, the Tuna in sight ahead at sundown took in the light sails Mizzen & Jigger parts continue moderate employed cleaning, mending & Boiling Black Fish Blubber with thick Foggy weather

Remarks Tues April 14th

Fore part took a light air from the N saw a Brig or Bark bent on board belonging on the coast got no news from Ship heading W by N finished Boiling & cleaned up decks the Tuna in sight to the Eastward saw another Sail on the weather Bow standing to the SE Eastward the B Fish made about 4 Mls Mizzen part - being Jigger part fine weather light air from the N to all hands employed making out the Fore Peak taking up the Ground tie which were rotten & stowing Tapes in their place for later

Long 74° 13' W Lat 35° 27' S

Remarks Wednes April 15th

Fore part light breeze from ESE heading to the NW finished & stowed off the Fore Peak & backed off at 5 1/2 P M saw a Bark standing to the Northward Mizzen & Jigger parts calm

Long 74° 11' W Lat 35° 37' S

Remarks Thurs April 16th

Fore part took a light breeze from the North steering E by S. I saw several Sails & plenty of Hump Backs true to Bomb on, did not get nigh enough employed cleaning & mending the Decks &c Mizzen & Jigger parts light air from the Northward at 11 AM the line hauled round to the Southward with rain steering SE by E the Tuna in sight all along shore

Banks to Talcahuano

Remarks Fri April 17th 1863

Fore part light air & Calm heading in to the Tuna east 25 or 30 miles one or two Sails in sight - our course SE 1/2 E Mizzen & Jigger parts strong breeze from S & E at daylight Carakina in sight on the weather Bism dist - 25 miles saw a number of Ships & Steamers but the Chaining

Remarks Satur April 18th

Fore part fresh breeze from the S W at 2 1/2 P M passed in by Carakina looked up the Bay & came to anchor at 7 P M in 4 fathoms later when the Capt went ashore carried all hands at daylight - hove up the anchor & moved the Ship into a better berth employed washing Ship &c the Storage Boy he shipped him a year ago went ashore got a Quarter of Beef & a Bag of Potatoes from shore

Remarks Sun April 19th

Fore part fine weather Mizzen & Jigger parts the same

Remarks Mon April 20th

Fore part the line from the N employed making out the after Hold to ascertain how much meat we had weighing the Chaining &c got a Bag of Potatoes & other vegetables from shore after dinner sent 7 Mls Black Fish Oil & three Mls of Shuck at 3 PM commenced a rain & rain like the rain cleared off in the night

Remarks Tues April 21st

Fore part fine weather got under & went to painting lower the Sails got a quarter of meat from the shore some sea coal from the Sapho &c Mizzen & Jigger parts moderate

Remarks Wednes April 22nd

Fore part fine finished painting got a Can of green Paint ashore & a sack of Potatoes Mizzen & Jigger parts fine discharged our Canvas
