Remarks Thursday April 23rd 1863

Fore part fine weather found the Sea Eye Boat & the
Pump that sea it to our outer Bobstay borne out sent
in the Sea Broom sent down the Foretop Ballast Mast
& the Sea Stay going to fit a new one got off 40 bags
Flour from the shore middle & latter parts fine
Discharged the men who came from some steamer Name
Alexander got a quantity of Beef & Soda & Stog for shore

Remarks Friday April 24th

Fore part fine employed filling the Eyes to the Fore
top Ball Back Stay & changed new Sea Stay & got the
Pump for the Bobstay piece ashore & fitted it in again
got a sack of Potatoes weighed the Foretop Mast took out
the Sea Stays all crushed down & put in a new one rigged
out the Sea Broom & set up some of the Sea Riggers
the line from the Northward but moderate

Remarks Saturday April 25th

Fore part the line from the Northward with thick
weather employed setting up the head rigging prime time
at 4 P.M. & washed off latter part thick & rainy

Remarks Sunday April 26th

Fore part & Northward with thick & rainy weather
Middle part the same latter part clear & fine

Remarks Monday April 27th

Fore part light wind from the North West employed getting
off 40 bags Flour & got some Calculating Made & sent
Flour from the shore. Snow let them have a pig
middle & latter parts fine

Remarks Tuesday April 28th

Fore part fine weather the Starboard Watch went
ashore on liberty the Watch broke out for Buller's Cape
got off some Bread & Sugar & latter parts
fine

Laying at Calcahuano
Remarks Wednesday April 29th 1863

Fore part moderate employed painting the Stern
Rig the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty took
on board from the water Boat 15 tons water middle
part strong breeze from the North with rain latter
part the wind from the Westward & moderate

Remarks Thursday April 30th

Fore part moderate the Starboard watch ashore on liberty
the watch on board employed making out for oil took on
board from the water Boat 4 tons water piece all the
casks took a Pipe of Oil on board a Steamer containing
295 gallons Opium & delivered a barrel to go on
shore of the same kind & a Box of Tobacco, stored
down a lot of water &c

Remarks Friday May 1st

Fore part moderate the Starboard watch ashore on liberty
the watch on board getting off wood & discharged the
cock sick & he went to the Hospital Middle & latter parts
moderate

Remarks Saturday May 2nd

Fore part the line from the N the Starboard watch
went on liberty sent on shore 1 Cigar & 1 bbl of Opium
Oil the watch on board employed cutting up & storing
away wood &c took on board two bags of Beans

Remarks Sunday May 3rd

Fore part fine the Starboard watch went ashore on
liberty Middle & latter parts continue fine

Remarks Monday May 4th

Fore part fine all hands on board except 2 men employed
painting some got off two Casks of Water &c
Middle & latter parts continue fine
