

Back Matitua Seas of Dartmouth Capt Howland

Remarks Manua July 29th 1863

Fore part took a light breeze from S, S E, standing off shore the land dist 3 or 4 miles, finished standing off from the two Casks with salt water the Captain went on board the Tribune of St Johns New Brunswick from Callow Brand to the Chincha's midair & latter part strong breeze looking to wind at 10 AM saw the Chincha's 4 points on the weather bow

No Ob.

Remarks Thursa July 30th

Fore part strong breeze looking up along shore at 6 PM the N Bland bore S dist 6 miles saw plenty of ships at Anchor midair & latter part moderate at 11 AM the Capt went ashore the ship standing in for the town

Remarks Frida July 31st

Fore part fine breeze the ship laying off & on between the Island & Main land the Boat came off at 4 PM two of the crew were missing John Davis & John Blair stood outside the Island & lay off & on during the night at 9 AM got in off the town & took a water Boat long sail & commenced taking in fresh water between 22 gallons Spum Oil to go on Board from Ship's Davis & Blair still absent

Remarks Satua Aug 1st

Fore part fine weather got through taking water at 2 PM took 150 lbs in all from two water Boats finished standing at below at 5 PM washed off the Capt came off with some sugar two & 1/2 sacks took up the Boat & stood to sea heading to the Southward midair part breezing on double reef the Top Sails latter part a Gale took Davis & Blair things off

Bouma to the Southward

Remarks Suna Aug 2nd 1863

Fore part strong Gale from S E heading to the S & W about the cable & put it below bet Kila & old Jarvis & Blair's things at auction amounting to some Fifty odd Dollars midair & latter parts the same

Lat 14° 34' S

Remarks Monu Aug 3rd

Fore part strong Gale heading S & W midair part the same at 7 AM wore ship to the E N E saw Black Fish lowered one Boat got nothing very rugged at the M. S. S.

Lat 15° 56' S

Remarks Tuesa Aug 4th

Fore part strong Gale from S E the ship under double reef Top Sails & Courses heading E N E arrived the watches midair & latter parts much the same

Lat 15° 09' S

Remarks Wednesa Aug 5th

Fore part strong double reef Top Sails breeze from the S E heading E N E, saw nothing midair part wore ship to the S latter part moderate made all sail started a Bl of Rain & Pook & some water into the Boat

Lat 15° 22' S

Remarks Thursa Aug 6th

Fore part moderate breeze from the Eastward sent down the Fore Top Sails & laid another sea some rain at 6 PM heading S by E midair & latter parts light breeze & calms employed at Ship's duty

Long 78° 13' W Lat 15° 26' S

Remarks Frida Aug 7th

Fore part light breeze with rain squalls midair part the same latter part cleared off some what employed repairing a Top Sail saw a Turtle

Long 78° 35' W Lat 15° 28' S
