Fore part strong breeze from N. W. with some rain
steering S. E. Midday part the wind hauling
to the W latter part the same since John Wilson

Remarks Wednes ^{20th} April 1864

Fore part strong breeze from the W steering S. E.
at 4 P.M. the wind hauling N. W. again & began
to fog up again fore part clear fine weather
Midday part the wind hauled N. latter part
a haze with rain at 11 A.M. the wind hauled
to the S. W. kept her off E

Remarks Thurs ^{21st} April 1864

Fore part strong breeze from the S. W. steering
E at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to the N. W.
& cleared off some off duty sick with various
complaints some have the Cape Horn Fever
& some the other kind Midday & latter
parts much the same

Long 71° 38' W Lat 57° 40' S

Remarks Fri ^{22nd} April 1864

Fore part strong Gale from the S. W. hauled
her up N. E. by E a heavy sea running the
ship making good weather of it so far
Midday part moderating latter part moderate
bark out for Water Vinegar Sugar Oil & Lard
Held saw a Schooner looking to the N

Remarks Satur ^{23rd} April 1864

Fore part light wind from the N. W. with some
rain steering N. E. at 5 P.M. the wind hauling
more to the N. W. raining harder from 7 to 11 P.M.
suddenly after that the wind hauled more to
the S. W. & cleared up latter part light breeze
from the W all day at steering N. E.

Long at 12 N 64 W Lat 56° 06' S

Remarks Sun ^{24th} April 1864

Fore part moderate breeze from the W with
good weather steering N. E. Midday & latter
parts moderate on ship in sight to the N. W.

Long 61° 35' W Lat 55° 57' S

Remarks Mon ^{25th} April 1864

Fore part light wind from the N. W. heading
to the N. E. at 4 P.M. the wind hauled more
to the W steering N. N. E. Midday & latter parts
calm on bark in sight

Lat 55° 58' S

Remarks Tues ^{26th} April 1864

Fore part calm at 4 P.M. took a light breeze from the
E. N. E. at 6 cleared to the N. with squally weather
Midday part taken again to the S. E. latter part
the wind from the Eastward heading to the N.
with some snow squally one ship in sight

Long 59° 32' W Lat 55° 30' S

Remarks Wednes ^{27th} April 1864

Fore part fresh breeze from the E heading to the N. N. E.
with cloudy weather & some snow squally Midday
& latter parts the same

Long 58° 48' W Lat 53° 43' S
