

Back Notice Vears of Dartmouth Capt. Howland
Remarks Tusa June 7th 1864

For part fresh breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. & by N. with fine weather employed at ship's duty. Midday & latter parts much the same
Long 26°30' W Lat 44°46' S

Remarks Wane June 8th

For part fresh breeze at S.E. steering N.W. & by N. with fine weather employed at ship's duty. Midday & latter parts the breeze light with rain squalls
Lat 2°36' S Long 26°52' W

Remarks Thurs June 9th

For part light breeze ranging from E to S.E. with some rain squalls employed shortening the forenoon. At steering N.E. by N. & by N. made some coasts crewing & knotting yards. Midday & latter parts much the same breeze but fine weather
Long 26°13' W Lat 00°48' S

Remarks Fri June 10th

For part fine breeze from E & S.E. steering N.E. by N. & by N. saw two ships this forenoon standing to the W. fine weather employed at ship's duty. Midday & latter parts the same
Long 26°33' W Lat 1°21' N

Remarks Sat June 11th

For part light breeze from E & S.E. steering N.E. by N. & by N. employed overhauling & taking the forenoon to the fore rigging. At 6 P.M. saw two sails. Midday & latter parts the same at 12 noon spoke the Lightning of Liverpool & had a gun
Long 26°54' W Lat 3°07' S

Bounce to the Western Islands

Remarks Tusa June 12th 1864

For part fine weather & moderate breeze from E & S.E. steering N.E. by N. at 2 P.M. the Capt. got back from gunning. Breeze forenoon & stood on our course the ship was 35 days from London. Hook out for water. Breeze picked up. Potatoes &c. Midday & latter parts steering N.E. & had some rain squalls
Long 25°50' W Lat 5°09' N

Remarks Mon June 13th

For part moderate breeze from S.E. steering N.E. & by E. had some light rain squalls at 3 P.M. steering N.E. by E. one ship in sight to windward. Midday & latter parts light variable breeze with rain squalls. 4 ships in sight - Long 25°00' W Lat 6°18' N

Remarks Tusa June 14th

For part light variable breeze at 4 P.M. began to rain. Rain ceased here but did the breeze from S. to N.W. overhauling & taking some of the forenoon to the main rigging. Midday & latter parts variable breeze & calm with rain squalls
No Ob.

Remarks Wane June 15th

For part light variable breeze & calm with rain squalls. 4 ships in sight. Midday part the same at 10 A.M. with the N.E. breeze heading N.W. by N. with frequent rain squalls. Saw about a dozen ships most of them standing to the S.
Long 24°57' W Lat 8°18' S
