

Back Matua Seas of Dartmouth Capt. [unclear]
Remarks June 26th 1864

For part fine breeze with moderate weather
employes at ships duty 2 ships in sight
at 10th after 4 PM Mianca & Gutter part
moored at 9 PM picked up a large
hump of Tallow about 2/3 of a Ninety
full at 10 1/2 AM the Capt left the ship
I went a gunning on board of a
Merchantman to Luena

Long 40° 48' W Lat 34° 35' N

Remarks June 27th

For part fine weather the Capt on board the
Merchant ship took in the Royal Top sails
Sails & Gills & Gaff Topped finally heaved
up the Mast for him to come up at 6 PM
the Capt got back with the Capt of the other
ship gave him a Bag of Potatoes &c at
7 PM he left where we have forward
heaving as the name of the ship was
Merrimack of Boston & away from Calcutta
bound to some port in Spain Mianca
& Gutter part continue moored

Long 40° 22' W Lat 32° 02' N

Remarks June 28th

For part light breeze from E to NE, heave
from N by W to N, NE, employes at
ships in sight all standing to the N
Mianca & Gutter part the same employ
scrapping the chains &c

Long 41° 08' W Lat 33° 32' N

Bound to the Western Isles

Remarks June 29th 1864

For part light air from the Eastward heave
to the Northward finished scraping &
Painting the Chains Painted the Anchors
several Sails in sight at 6 PM raised Whales
& Shirts on the deck 4 miles off called them
Spinn Whales went ship to the S at 7 PM went
to the South where there was any time during
the night calm most of the time Gutter
part the same saw nothing Lat 33° 41' N

Remarks June 30th

For part light variable air & calm with some rain
several ships in sight at 5 PM Black ship with a
light breeze from the Eastward heading to
the N & E, at 10 PM Mianca & Gutter part
much the same employes repairing an
old Fore Sail 6 ships in sight

Long 41° 50' W Lat 34° 14' N

Remarks July 1st

For part light air from the E heading to the
N & E finished the Fore Sail matted the new
one & bent the old one put some new Buntline
clothes on the new one & stowed it away at
5 PM picked up an old Dick Bury ship in
sight Mianca & Gutter part much the same
employes repairing an old Top Sail Painted
the Chains again on the Statua side

Long 42° 10' W Lat 35° 06' N

Remarks July 2nd

For part nice breeze from the E heading to the
N & E finished the Top Sail & bent it at 4 PM
forward 7 ships in sight Mianca part moored
at 8 AM raised a school of large Spinn Whales
we were heading to the E the whales were to Luena going
to Luena & N E Luena Long 42° 22' W Lat 35° 38' N
