

Back Malacca Coast of Dutchmouth Capt Hartland

Remarks Saturday Aug 6<sup>th</sup> 1864

Five feet moderate breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> blowing to the N<sup>W</sup> E moderate & latter part light winds & calm, two sails in sight saw brampores

Remarks Sunday Aug 7<sup>th</sup>

Five feet light winds & calm, moderate & latter part much the same caught a Turtle

Remarks Monday Aug 8<sup>th</sup>

Five feet light wind from N<sup>W</sup> heading N<sup>NE</sup> on sail in sight fine weather moderate & latter part light winds & calm, two sails in sight at 9 A.M. the Capt. hoisted a pulser for a Brig about three miles off got back again between ten & eleven when we hoisted foreward again steering N<sup>SE</sup> the wind from the N<sup>W</sup>

Aug 32<sup>nd</sup> 50<sup>th</sup> Lat 41<sup>st</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> N

Remarks Tuesday Aug 9<sup>th</sup>

Five feet light wind from the N<sup>W</sup> steering N<sup>SE</sup> at 3 P.M. spoke a Spanish Brig from Portugal no more being handy or we should speak another before night. Moderate part the wind hauld more to the N<sup>W</sup> latter part fine breeze

Aug 32<sup>nd</sup> 47<sup>th</sup> Lat 42<sup>nd</sup> 38<sup>th</sup> N

Remarks Wednesday Aug 10<sup>th</sup>

Five feet moderate breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering N<sup>NE</sup>, saw one Brig standing to the N<sup>W</sup> moderate & latter part fine weather at day light saw a Whaler, huffed too the wind at 11 A.M. kept off for her

Cruising on the western coast

Remarks Thursday Aug 11<sup>th</sup> 1864

Five feet fine got under to the back at 10 1/2 P.M. proved to be the house of New Bedford Capt. Dean 3 years out 1600 Gamma moderate part squally the Capt got on board at 10 1/2 P.M. latter part strong breeze with rain squally Aug 33<sup>rd</sup> 34<sup>th</sup> Lat 44<sup>th</sup> 29<sup>th</sup> N

Remarks Friday Aug 12<sup>th</sup>

Five feet strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering S<sup>W</sup> saw back when we come from, but told & saw two ships at dusk huffed to the wind heaving to the N<sup>W</sup> latter part steering E fresh breeze

Lat 44<sup>th</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> N

Remarks Saturday Aug 13<sup>th</sup>

Five feet strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> huffed to the wind heading S<sup>SE</sup>, saw a Schooner standing to the N<sup>W</sup> moderate & latter part much the same at noon huffed to the N<sup>W</sup>

Aug 32<sup>nd</sup> 44<sup>th</sup> Lat 44<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> N

Remarks Sunday Aug 14<sup>th</sup>

Five feet strong breeze from S<sup>SE</sup>, heading S<sup>W</sup> saw a number of vessels standing to the E cloudy weather at 6 P.M. thick & raining wet told & at dusk bore a French Bark from Brazil moderate & latter part fresh breeze

Lat 43<sup>rd</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> N

Remarks Monday Aug 15<sup>th</sup>

Five feet strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering N<sup>W</sup> at 7 P.M. double reefed the Top Sails moderate part squally with thunder & lightning & plenty of rain latter part the wind hauld to the N<sup>W</sup> weather & moderate some heaving to the N<sup>SE</sup>
