

Saturday Sept. 14th Commences with moderate winds from S.W. at 6 P.M. recruits and all hands on board. Shipped 2 Men, and a Boy also, Portuguese, at 8 Do. Steered S.E. latter part employed in hoisting out the oil from between Decks and getting it to Land at Fayal thick weather ends the Day with moderate winds from W.

Sunday Sept. 15th. Comm. with moderate winds from W. S.W. and thick weather with small rain Steering S.E. by S. at 8 P.M. shortened Sail heading on different tacks through the night at Daylight kept away for Fayal, latter part light winds at Noon Calm Fayal bearing S.E. 14 mi. Dis - - -

Monday Sept. 16th. At 10 Am. I landed at Fayal, at 3 P.M. landed 87 bbls oil to be shipped home at 12 Do. All hands on board and made the best of way to sea with light airs and Calms, at 4 P.M. light winds from the S.E. and Calms the Ship working up to the Town, as ends the Day.

Tuesday Sept. 17th. At 3 P.M. the Bark up abreast of the Town landed the oil to be shipped home by the Consul, Shipped 4 Men, Joseph Francis absconded from the Boat at 8 returned on board latter part light winds from the Westward and Calms at Noon Lat. by obs. 38° 11' N. the W. P. of Fayal bearing S.W.

Wednesday Sept. 18th Commences with light winds from the W. at 3 P.M. spoke the Br. Ship London of London, Jaffray Seales Commander from Madras at May, Cape Good Hope 27th July Helena 10th Aug. Bound to London, went on board of him and spent 2 or 3 hours found him a gentleman, got a speaking trumpet and Chandiear, free of any Expence, Steered to the Eastward latter part fresh breezes at Noon St. Michael bearing E. by Compass, Lat. by Obs. 37° 40' N.

Thursday Sept. 19th. Commences with fresh breezes from W. Steering on Diff Courses to the Eastward saw saw Breaches, at 6 P.M. Strong winds and thick weather Steered S. under all Sail, middle part Squally and raining at 2 Am. took in the Topgallant sails at 7 Do. made all Sail again strong winds and overcast sends Lat. by obs. 35° 41' N. Long. by D.R. 25° 22' W.

Friday Sept. 20th First part Strong winds from S.W. Latter part Winds from S. to E. and overcast Steering S.W. by Compass Lat. by obs. 33° 09' N. Long. by Chrs. 23° 54' W. First part fresh breezes from E. Steering S. Middle and latter part light variable Winds from E. to S. and thick weather with small rain, Steering on different Courses to the Southward S.W. obs. Lat. by D.R.

Sunday Sept. 22nd. light variable winds from E. to S. Steering on different Courses to the Southward Lat. by obs. 29° 50' N. Long. by Chrs. 23° 40' West

Monday Sept. 23rd. Light winds from S.E. to S. Steering on different courses to the Southward Lat. by obs. 28° 34' N. Long. by Chrs. 23° 30' W.

Tuesday Sept. 24th. Winds from E. and fair Steering to the Southward variously employed lost the Pigeons overboard Lat. by obs. 27° 20' N. Long. by Chrs. 23° 20' W.

I am now laid up with the Rheumatism in my left Shoulder Wednesday Sept. 25th Strong winds from E. to S. Steering by Compass under all Sail, I am a very little better of the Rheumatism Lat. by obs. 24° 41' N. - Long. by Chrs. 22° 34' West.

Thursday Sept. 26th. Strong trades from E. Steering by W. under all Sail Lat. by obs. 21° 46' N. Long. by Chrs. 22° 25' W.

Friday Sept. 27th. Strong trades from E. Steering by W. under all Sail Lat. by obs. 18° 50' N. Long. by Chrs. 22° 18' West.
